

The Mikado comes to Vegas

As the fall semester begins, UNLV comes to life with talent and productive energy through the University Theatre's 1994-95 "Frolic Fest." To mark the opening of the season the UNLV Department of Theatre Arts, in collaboration with the UNLV Opera Theatre and UNLV Munic Department, is presenting The Mikado.

This delightful operetta begins on Sept. 29 at the Judy Bayley Theatre and will feature the distinctive talents of students Christi Smith, Martine Allard and Elizabeth Brownlee.

The Mikado, a touching love story set in Japan, is filled with political satire and is considered to be one of Gilbert and Sullivan's most popular operettas. Much of the ancient Japanese culture and beliefs are reflected in the plot.

"The play is in many respects a satire about power and keeping your head attached to your neck," said the director of the production, Robert Brewer, who also directed the delightfully funny yet intensely controversial Jesus Christ Superstar, which was performed last year at Artemus Ham Hall.

Brewer's genius stems from his 20 years of professional experience a as faculty member of the Julliard School of Drama, working with the San Francisco Opera, and as Director of the Musical Theatre Program at UNLV.

The Mikado is full of subplots, and the characters range from being intensely comic to intensely evil. According to Paul Truckey, a gifted and experienced member of the cast of characters, "Nanki-poo (the young lover in pursuit of a lady who is betrothed to someone else) is manipulative yet he has a lot of sincerity, he wants very desperately to be able to love Yum-Yum, he just wants his father's good graces on that." Nanki-Poo's father is in fact the Mikado, who Truckey describes as "the relatively evil ruler in Japan at that time."

Among the organizers and creators of the production are Paul Kreider, the director of the UNLV Opera Theatre Department, David Weiller, head of choral studies, as musical director, and Joe Aldridge, a faculty member, as lighting designer. Sam Sousa is the scenic designer and Kerri Bechtal is the costume designer.

Tragi-comedy, political commentary, and an overflow of romance, *The Mikado* is a definite must-see!
