

Outdoor Store Caters to Student Adventures

The UNLV Outdoor Adventures and Rental Shop, located in Room 137 in the MSU, offers a variety of outdoors trips and an abundance of outdoor equipment for rent.

Excursions offered include camping, hiking, canoe and kayak treks. Horseback adventures, deep sea fishing, rock climbing and rappelling, and national excursions are also offered.

"I think everybody should spend some time in the outdoors to find their true selves," says Ryan Koblasa, a 23-year-old communications major. "The Outdoor shop provides students with the perfect opportunity."

The Outdoor shop, which started out as a closet operation ran by a student out of his dorm room is now a university funded program.

making a lot of progress. We're offering some new trips this year that we've never had before."

Among the new trips is the La Sal mountains back-country ski trip. This five day, four night cross country ski excursion takes you deep into the woods of Utah's second highest mountain range. The tour utilizes a hut-to-hut system where skiers will camp at three different rustic cabins during the journey. The primitive huts provide a high-quality, back-country experience in a solitary wilderness wonderland. The price for this expedition is only \$300 for university students and faculty.

If students or faculty don't have



the equipment to enjoy the outdoors, the Outdoor shop offers
rentals of just about any equipment needed from tents, sleeping bags and backpacks to canoes and kayaks. The shop also
offers recreational equipment
such as volleyball sets, frisbees
and footballs. And for those who

alone, the shop even rents maps

"We've bought a lot of new equipment this year," Morse says. "We have canoes, sit-atop kayaks, life vests and a bunch of other stuff. We don't have to spend the money renting from other places, (so) we've been able to lower our prices considerably on both the adventures and the
