"Michigan State played a solid game," Barto said. "We need to work on providing a stronger scoring threat."

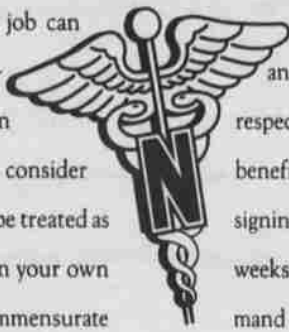
Actually things aren't as bad as they seem. With a 4-6 record, the Rebels have posted some big wins, and have been competitive in most of their contests.
