

Debate Brings Award

Debate teams from 23 schools participated in the "Las Vegas Debates" Tournament the Oct. 8th weekend, hosted by the UNLV Forensics/Debate program and the Greenspun School of Communication.

This is the fourth year UNLV has hosted the tournament under the direction of Dr. Barbara Pickering. Pickering noted, "In the past four years attendance at our tournament has continued to grow. Debate programs around the country have found Las Vegas to be an attractive site, both for competitive reasons and because of our tourist attractions."

Forty-six teams participated in the tournament, with 34 senior and 18 in junior division teams. Participants included members of the first and second place National Debate Tournament championship teams. Competitors from 13 states participated in the three-day event on the UNLV campus.

Outstanding speaker awards were given to the top speakers in each division. The UNLV team of Chirsty Maloney and Michelle Matlock were named first and second speakers respectively in the junior division. The top two senior division speaker awards went to Sean McCaffity and Jody Terry from Northwestern University.

The first place award in junior division went to Tony Davis and Marcy Rand from the University of Utah. Senior division champions were Tim Barouch and Chris Lundberg from Redlands University. Barouch and Lundberg finished the tournament with a undefeated record of 12-0.

Sweepstakes awards were given to the top three schools at the tournament. Third place went to Trinity University of San Antonio, Texas; second place went to the University of Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah; and first place to Redlands University, Redlands, California.

The UNLV team will resume their competitive season Oct. 15 at the Aztec Invitational Tournament, held at San Diego State University.

Us - in Southern Nevada, Florida, California, and Texas - were under federal investigation for fraudulently diagnosing patients.

Greeson was also sued by insurance companies Blue Cross and Aetna. "It was a frivolous harassment suit," she said. Greeson countersued.

The case with Blue Cross has been settled, but under the terms of the settlement Greeson agreed to a gag order prohibiting either party from discussing the case. Greeson did say Blue Cross wrote a letter exonerating her.

In a Sept. 14 article, the *Las Vegas Review-Journal* reported that Greeson said the federal investigation is no longer active. In that article, Greeson said that the three-year investigation had not resulted in any charges against her.

Greeson remains upbeat about her chances in the Nov. 8 election. "The politicians are serving special interest groups and not serving the people," she said. "We need a voice"
