The restaurant is staffed entirely by Hotel Administration majors who are completing the required hands-on restaurant training class.

College of Hotel Administration lecturer Mohsen Azizsoltani, said The Rebel Grill does brisk business, with an average of 125 covers served daily. Lunch is served between 11:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Tuesday-Thursday.

"We usually open The Rebel Grill about four or five weeks into the semester, when students have had a chance to become familiar with the skills needed to run the operation," Azizsoltani said.

"Each week we have a different team (usually three students) who organize and plan the different lunch themes," Azizsoltani said. "This week, the students

have selected the '60s as the theme, and it has been very well planned and received."

Azizsoltani said diners of The Rebel Grill will get a wide choice of selections throughout the semester. "Next week we will have a Western theme, with the following week done in Mediterranean style," Azizsoltani said.

While each week the array of specialty selections changes, the restaurant offers a standard menu, with prices ranging from \$1.50 for a bowl of homemade soup to the highest price item, a Ribeye steak, topping out at \$7.50.

A complete selection of wine, beer and spirits is also offered, with domestic beer priced at \$2 and imports at \$2.50.

Overseeing the kitchen is lecturer and Chef Jean Hertzman. She said the class is designed to introduce students to the basics of restaurant operation. "Our students will work ten different positions," Hertzman said. "One week they may be washing dishes, and the next they could be working one of the cooking positions."

Hertzman said the restaurant has been very busy this year, and judging from the number of positive comment cards the students receive, patrons are very satisfied. Hertzman said selections have been made more affordable this year, which has resulted in more students dining at The Rebel Grill.

For students and faculty looking for a place to have their morning coffee or espresso, the Rebel grill is open mornings between 7:30 and 10 a.m. Fresh bagels, croissants and a variety of pastries are offered also.
