The Rebels (5-4, 4-1) have another bye this weekend and finish out Big West play against the WolfPack Nov. 19 and host Kansas State Nov. 26.

Junior Calvin Weis completed the Rebels' freestyle supremacy with a time of 22.02 to capture the 50-yard contest.

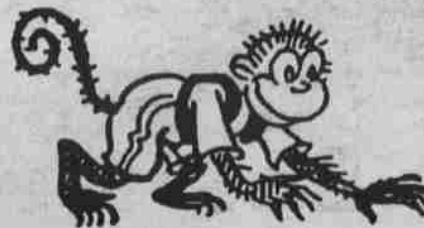
Sinai collared both the 100 and 200-yard backstroke events

weekend with a meet at the University of Utah Friday before facing Brigham Young University Saturday.

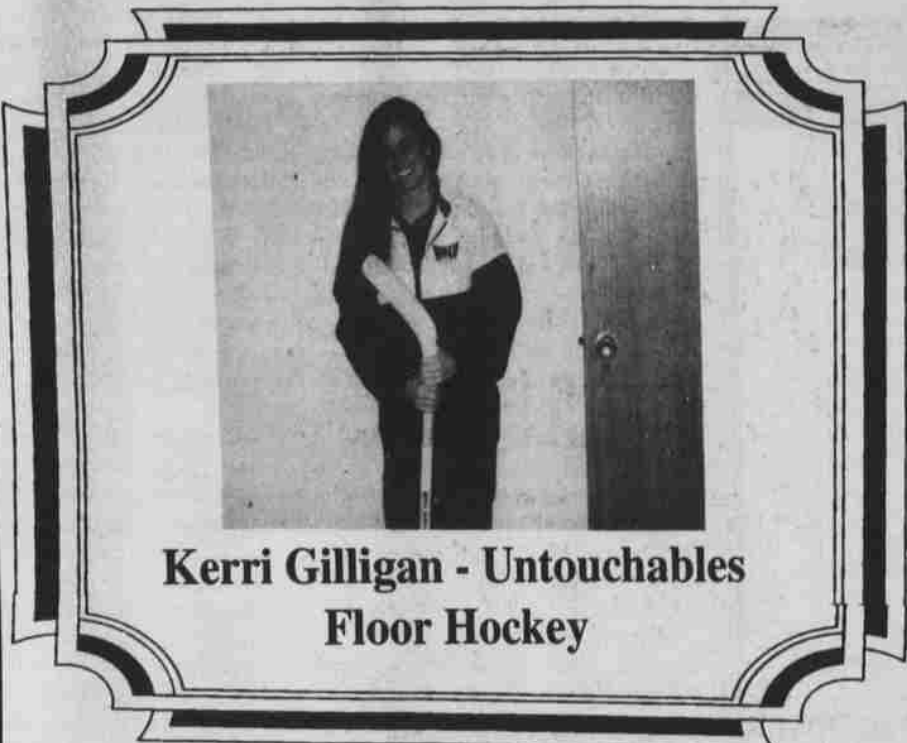
