The camp, set to begin at 12:30 p.m. and conclude at 6:45 p.m., will include several speakers,

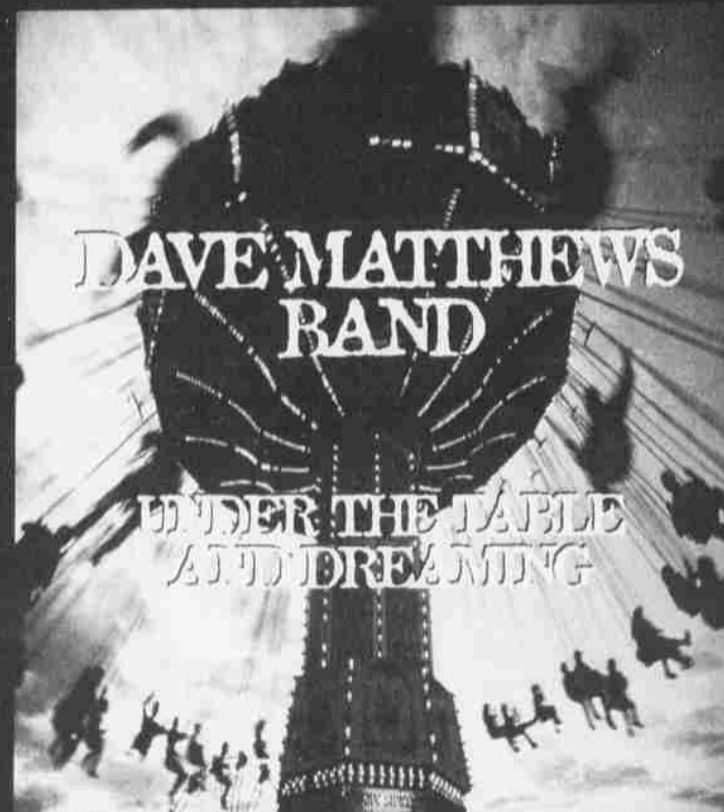
Jonnie Estelle, director of Minority Affairs at California Western School of Law, who will speak on "The Mechanics of the Law School Admissions Process."
