Dr. James V. Taranik, president of Desert Research Institute, has been selected to take part in a White House review of national laboratories.

Taranik will join the NASA Federal Laboratory Review Task Force to analyze laboratories that manage NASA's major enterprises, such as Humans in Space and Aeronau-

tical Technology.

NASA Associate Administrator Charles Kennel named Taranik to the Earth, Space, and Technology Subcommittee. It will review NASA's programs for studying the earth and the solar system. The committee will make recommendations to NASA Administrator Dan Golden on the future of these major NASA centers.

continued from 1 last) eight years; that's a tremendous amount of growth."

Increased enrollment is attributed to several factors, including the overall growth in population of the Las Vegas Valley area and relatively low tuition at UNLV. Ackerman also added that the amount of publicity the university receives and regional recruiting, which was not allowed until recent years, have played a big role.

Ackerman said he thinks growth is important. "It adds quality, credibility and new programs to the institution. The future of the institution is directly tied to growth and financial support depends on a head count."

Growth can be detrimental without the continued support to match it, Ackerman said. Although the campus was designed to physically accommodate 35,000 students, whether it can actually support that many is a

legislative question.

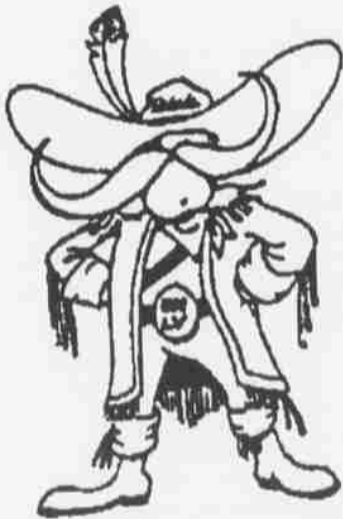
"We've grown too quick, too fast," Ackerman said. "State financial support hasn't kept up with the demands of the growing student body."

Ackerman emphasized the ramifications of a hiring freeze imposed during the 1991 session, saying that lack of funding results in a decrease in quality of service.

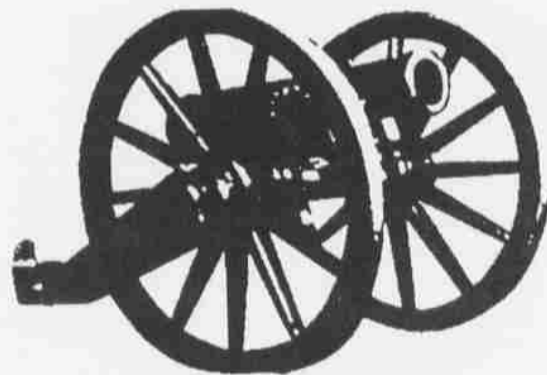
"The last time we added a staff member to the financial aid office was during the 1989-1990 session, in which \$12.9 million in federal financial aid was distributed. The same number of staff distributed \$25.4 million during the 1993 session."

"We've added the CBC building and the new Student Services Complex to accommodate students," Jeff Halverson, dean of Admissions and Records said. "I think the university is in good shape as far as facilities are concerned," adding that he also believed the campus is growing in accordance with the increase in the number of students.
