

states. He said that non-resident enrollments at Nevada's universities and community colleges are increasing, largely due to large tuition increases and capacity reduction in California that are forcing Californians to seek post secondary education outside the state. Further, other western states have strengthened policy would ensure that out-of-state students contribute a higher portion of the true cost of their education in Nevada.

The policies of Nevada's neighboring states are built on a presumption that if a student comes to a state for the purpose of attending school, that student is, and will remain, a non-resident for tuition purposes. The current Nevada policy is not built on this assumption. Further, the policies of other western states generally differentiate between dependent students and adult independent students. Residency of dependent students is established by the residency (domicile) of parents of guardians. As long as students remain dependent on non-resident parents or guardians, they cannot qualify for residency status. Residency of an independent student is generally established by their physical domicile and intent of permanent domicile. Nevada's current policy does not distinguish between dependent and indepen-

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residency. Finally, the policies of the contiguous western states require at least 12 months prior residence for consideration of resident status. Nevada currently requires 6 months.

## Non-Resident, Part-time Students

The UCCSN Board of Regents approved a change in the tuition and fees policy for non-resident, part-time students taking six or less credits per semester. This policy change was necessary to achieve parity in per credit hour charges with the recently revised "Good Neighbor" policy. Begin-ning in Fy 1995-96, all non-residents students shall pay a tuition charge in addition to the per-credit consolidated registration fee applicable to all students. Non-resident students who are not covered by the "Good Neighbor" policy and who register for up to six credit hours in a semester shall pay the following tuition per credit hour: undergraduates will pay \$52 and graduates at the universities will pay \$42, while community college st dents will pay \$15.50 This po icy change will result in non-res ident Good Neighbor students an non-resident part-time students paying the same per credit co ts of: \$46 for the community co leges, \$110 for undergraduates at the universities and \$124 for graduates at the universities.

Derby Days, which is the single largest philanthropic event at UNLV, encourages organizations to work together towards a common goal and to establish new links with the community while strengthening the old.




Another event held on campus last week consisted of a Jail-A-Thon which took place in the Alumni Amphitheater, grossing over \$800.
