 Security and Medicare should use real need as a criteria. He also said America needs to invest in infrastructure.

"We have to have the most exquisitely trained people in the world. They have to be the best at high-tech," Cuomo added. He said we have to invest in people. Cuomo noted that the contract doesn't give money for that.

About social problems Cuomo said, "You're not going to solve the problems by saying welfare created the problem. Welfare did not create the problem. That is like blaming the bandage for the wound. Poverty created the problem."

Cuomo said he doesn't believe babies are having babies for the poverty money. Rather, he said, he believes for these girls, having a baby is what they view as their best alternative in a sorry situation.

He holds up a Tennessee program of Henry Foster's (Surgeon

General candidate) and a program from New York as examples of plans that work for attacking this problem. The New York plan lowered the birth rate among teen mothers 66 2/3% in target areas.

The plan as Cuomo outlined it is simple. As governor of New York, he made reforms in the welfare program that provided day care for the child and paid one half the girl's pay. In return, he asked for the name of the father to make him pay support and a promise from the girl not to have anymore babies.

While Cuomo said that the Republican Contract advocates survival of the fittest, he admonishes us to remember one thing. "In a dog eat dog world, you end up with just one dog."

"As a nation," Cuomo suggests, "we must do something to unite us."

With only 6 percent to 7 percent of the budget spent on welfare, when all programs are totaled together, Cuomo asks, "Are you telling me this is the economic problem?"

He said that the babies having babies are being used as scapegoats because they are easy targets.

Cuomo blames the problems in the urban ghettos on population density. He stresses that it is not ethnicity that creates the problems but the poverty that piles people on top of people.

Television saturates kids with sex and violence Cuomo said. If they see it all the time, they are going to go out and do it.

Cuomo summed it all up. "All we need to do is to come together, reason together, live together, and love together."

At a press conference Monday afternoon, Cuomo said he wasn't interested in running for any office. He is currently doing speaking engagements, a newspaper column, a thought-talk radio show and working on a new book.

About the next presidential election, Cuomo said he hoped that Robert Dole and Colin Powell don't run together. He thinks that would be a tough ticket for Clinton to beat.

 ed with the current analog signal stations now use.

CBS has donated equipment to KUNV which will be used for the demonstration. The equipment will allow KUNV to upgrade to the digital system sometime in the next five years at a substantial cost savings. "This will be a great benefit to KUNV," Sullivan noted.

The convention participants will be driven around town in a specially equipped bus set up

with both an analog and the new digital signal so a side-by-side comparison can be made.

Sullivan said one of the reasons KUNV was chosen because of its Jazz programming. "Our Jazz programming is very well established in the community, and

Jazz is the perfect musical format for the comparison."

According to Sullivan, CBS thinks the system will be in wide use within five years. Sullivan was very upbeat about the project. "We will be able to say we were the first."
