Scholarships are part of the attraction for most students to join. The amount of the scholarships that are available are based upon the number of new members that join. If 450 new members join, then there is a \$450 scholarship for one junior and one senior. All members, includ ing new members, are eligible for the scholarships. A blue profile form that is sent with the invitation letter is used as a basis for judging for the scholarships. The criteria used to judge recipients uses gpa first, then campus activities and accomplishments.
