and change, hoping to predict the likely direction the change will take. They are looking for a basic understanding of viruses.

This could aid in an antiviral agent development. The pharmaceutical industry can use the patterns recognized by the group to develop new drugs.

In addition, McClure said, her group uses a highly uncommon and relatively new approach. All of the work they do with the viruses is on a computer. She has no wet lab. This field has existed for only ten years. She says that things can be done with the computer that cannot be accomplished in the wet-lab.

The group is interested in theory only. Conceivably, some of the discoveries made by the group

would be taken by scientists who do application work and tested McClure said. Mendoza works with rabies-like viruses. Two other members of her group work with retroviruses which is the category that HIV falls into.

Mendoza graduated from Rancho High School with high honors. He is a recipient of the Kevin M. Devos Scholarship. He received the UNLV Excellence in Preparatory Chemistry Award in '92, and he was on the Dean's Honor List '92-'94.

Mendoza said he is the CSUN representative for the Student Science Program which he hopes will be reactivated by next year. He is involved in the Association for Pre-Health Professionals and the Chemistry Society.

Mendoza volunteered for Val-

ley Hospital in the emergency room as well as in McClure's lab, where he impressed her to approach him with an invitation to join her research group.

He is an undergrad majoring in pre-med with a minor in chemistry. Although Mendoza is a fourth-year senior with enough credits to graduate in May, he said he will stay on another year to complete his experience in McClure's research group.

McClure is one of two scientists on campus with a NIH grant.
