

Former Rebels Relocate

The Las Vegas Posse has officially disbanded, and the team's disassembly has left some former UNLV football players with new professional addresses.

In Tuesday's Canadian Football League dispersal draft, four former Rebels, including three ex-Posse players changed teams. Stephen Anderson, a UNLV defensive lineman in 1992-93, was selected as the first pick of the second round, the 14th overall, by Birmingham. Anderson (6-2, 268 lbs) was a member of the Posse last season.

Jason Medlock, a linebacker at UNLV in 1992-93, was selected as the 24th overall pick of the second round by Calgary. Medlock (6-3, 240 lbs) set the Rebels' single-season record for most tackles in a season, 137 in 1993, and was also a member of last

year's Posse team.

David "Hot Dog" Hollis, a four-year starter at defensive back with the Rebels from 1983-86, was selected by Calgary in the third round with the 37th pick. Hollis (6-0, 196 lbs), a starter on the Posse last season, also played on the Seattle Seahawks from 1987-1989.

Don Odegard, a Rebel defensive back in 1989, was traded from Hamilton to Memphis so the Tiger Cats could select Posse quarterback Anthony Calvillo with the first overall pick. Odegard played for the Cincinnati Bengals and the New York Jets previously. Calvillo played at Utah State, and was the MVP of Las Vegas Bowl II in 1993.

Swingers Finish Fifth In Arizona

Golf: Rebels now prepare for BWC Championships

The fourth-ranked UNLV golf team closed out its regular season, shooting a final-round 298 to give them a fifth-place finish at the 23rd Annual Thunderbird ASU Intercollegiate in Tempe, Ariz., Sunday.

The team standing meant the Rebels finished in the top five in five of their six tournaments this spring.

UNLV finished 13 strokes behind champion Arkansas,

which came from behind to nip host Arizona State. The Sundevils, however, did have the individual titlist as Todd Demsey shot a 213.

Mike Ruiz was the individual medalist for the Rebels, tying Stanford's Tiger Woods and five others for 12th place, with a 76-73-71—220, finishing seven strokes off the lead.

All-American Chris Riley tied for 37th with a 224, ending his 10-event streak of top-20 finishes. Chad Campbell also carded a three-round 224.

Mike Vance followed closely behind with a 225, good enough for a tie at 42nd, while preseason All-American Gilberto Morales continued to struggle, finishing in a tie for 58th at 228, with his third consecutive tourney outside the top 40.

UNLV will begin its postseason

by heading to Las Cruces, N.M., for the Big West Conference Championships May 1-2.

"We're peaking right now," coach Dwaine Knight said. "Just about everybody is 100 percent healthy. Riley's about 85 percent with his hamstring injury, while Gilberto is 100 percent healthy from his back injury."

"We've gained some momentum heading into the conference championship, and we anticipate winning it all. Right now, our short game is impressive—the putting and chipping. The timing is good."

The Rebels' three-position climb in the recent edition of the Golf Week/Taylor Made rankings to No. 4 is paralleled by a No. 5 ranking in the nation's other major poll.

ing just two hits while striking out five and walking four.

The 49ers scored one in the second, which was matched by the Lady Rebels in the third. The score remained locked at one until the top of the eighth, when the Lady Rebels pushed three across to break open the game.

Crandall was the big bat of the first game, going 2-3 with two triples and an RBI. Following that performance was Rondina, who went 1-4 with a double and a run scored.

The Lady Rebels struck first in the second game, putting one across in their half of the first inning. It proved to be the only Lady Rebel run of the game.

The 49ers tied the game up in the fourth on a wild pitch by

Teresa Branch, and then went ahead in the fifth on another unearned run. That was enough to beat the Lady Rebels, as Stewart finished up the game for Branch in the fifth. Branch collected her sixth loss of the season. She struck out four and walked two in the game, while she allowed two hits.

Against Cal State-Fullerton, the No. 4 team in the nation, the Lady Rebels played two hard fought games. The first had Stewart, going for her 18th win of the season, pitching another complete game. She went six innings, giving up three walks and striking out one, while allowing nine hits, but fell a run short of the victory.

The Lady Rebels held a four-run lead heading into the bottom of the fourth. They built up the cushion on the strength of Stewart's fourth home run of the sea-

son, a two-run shot to left. Mallett and Rondina also had big games, each putting up two hits and a run scored in the losing effort.

Rondina let it all out in the second half of the doubleheader, going 4-4 with a home run, two doubles and a single. She knocked in three and scored twice as well. With this performance, she raised her season average to .430, and set new team records for home runs (7) and doubles (18) in a season.

Branch started the game and pitched 3 2/3 innings. She gave up eight hits and four runs, while not striking out or walking anyone. Stewart relieved her to get one out in the fourth, and then finished up the game for Branch, who has been struggling through a sore hip. Stewart struck out three and walked one, while only giving up one hit.
