Lady Stringers Sweep Easter Weekend

The UNLY women's tennis team received their Easter presents early this weekend when they beat UC Santa Barbara and Utah.

"It was the best effort overall this season," coach Ola Malmqvist said. "I was very pleased. We beat a team that was at one time ranked 15, and are the defending Big West champs."

After the weekend's battles, the No. 39 Lady Rebels raised their overall record to 14-7, 4-0 in the Big West.

The Lady Rebels started out the weekend with their first ever victory over the four-time Big West Champions UCSB. They beat them, 5-4, with gutsy play on the singles court.

Five of six singles matches went to the Lady Rebels, but they dropped all three doubles matches to allow the Lady Gauchos to climb a little closer in the end.

Marianne Vallin, ranked 50th nationally, went three sets to get her 21st win of the season, 6-4, 3-6, 7-6. Lisa Annebro, Astrid Copano, Ljiljana Kordic and Shiera Stuart all registered wins in singles action as well. The only loss came at No. 2 singles where Marie Linusson fell quickly to Lynn Coakley, 3-6, 2-6.

In doubles, the Copano/Vallin team fell in a tough loss, 4-6, 6-1, 6-7. They lost to the 19thranked doubles team in the nation. Annebro/

Stuart and Kordic/Linusson were the other doubles victims in the second half of the match.

"I don't think we played good doubles," Malmqvist said. "We had already clinched the match though, but I was still a little concerned. We'll practice more on it before the conference tournament."

On Senior Day at the Fertitta Tennis Complex, both departing seniors, Copano and Stuart, won their matches in quick fashion. Copano played almost errorless tennis as she destroyed Sarah Mecham in straight sets, 6-0, 6-0. Stuart also played one of her best matches of the season, defeating Angie Olson, 6-2, 6-2.

At No. 1 singles, Vallin battled through a broken thumb on her non-playing hand to win a hard fought three-set match, 6-4, 1-6, 6-2. Annebro and Kordic also came up with strong victories. Linusson fell once again in the Lady Rebels only loss of the day, 1-6, 3-6.

"Marie has been a little unlucky lately," Malmqvist said. "She hasn't been playing well, and has had problems with her confidence. Hopefully, by the conference tournament she'll be playing better."

With the win over UCSB, the Lady Rebels stand a good chance at being the No. 1 seed in the Big West Championships at Ojai, Calif., April 26-29. It would be the first time in school history that the Lady Rebels are seeded No. 1.

With the sweep over LBSU, coach McDonald moved two wins closer to the magical number of 300. Currently, she is sitting on win number 299, and could reach the milestone this weekend when they face San Jose St. at 11 a.m. Saturday.

"I didn't really know about it" McDonald said. "It's just another award on the wall. It's really a team award. UNLV got 300 wins. Many players have helped us to get there, not just the coaching."

The Lady Rebels continue on the current homestand. After SJSU, they face Pacific Sunday at noon, and then finish out with New Mexico St. at 1 p.m. Wednesday-the last Lady Rebel home game of the season.
