Student tickets for football being distributed

Student tickets for the first two home Rebel football games will be distributed Wednesday starting at 7 a.m. at the Thomas & Mack box office.

Tickets also will be handed out in the Mover Student Union lobby on Tuesday, Sept. 5 and Wednesday, Sept. 6 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

There is a sellout campaign for the first game against Arkansas State on Sept. 9. The Athletic Development office wants to get students to fill Sam Boyd Stadium to capacity. The second game is against Hawaii on Sept. 30.

To get tickets students must have their student ID with them. Full-time students are allowed one free ticket to each game, and can purchase up to three more at half price. Part-time students may buy up to four tickets per game at half price.

Rebel's baseball finishes season in fourth

After an up and down 1994-95 season, the UNLV baseball team finished fourth in the Big West with a 32-24 record.

The Rebels ended the season by traveling to Long Beach for the first Big West Baseball Tournament, where they earned one of only four spots. Other schools involved in the tournament were Long Beach State, Cal State Fullerton and UCLA.

The Rebels went into the tournament with a three-game winning streak, and also winners of seven of their last 10. Their train was derailed, however, as the Rebels dropped their last eight games.

The tournament started with the Rebels facing Long Beach State for three games, where they promptly lost all three games and continued on the same route. Cal State Fullerton followed up with their domination of the Rebels by beating them 12-1, and the mercy stroke for UNLV came from UCLA with a three-game set in which the Bruins scored in double figures every games.

The Hustlin' Rebels finish up with their18th 30 win and above .500 season in the past 20 years.


Freshman third baseman Ryan Hankins was named to the Freshman All-America team by Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball. He batted .383 on the season with 12

home runs and 49 RBI. Hankins also collected 18 doubles and had a .625 slugging percentage.

Sophomore pitcher Nate Yeskie also finished with Big West All American honors. He went 11-5 with a 4.36 ERA and a 147 strikeouts, which is a school record.

Two players were drafted by Major League teams. Catcher Travis McClendon was picked up by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 25th round and pitcher Joel Garber was drafted in the 33rd round by the Chicago White Sox.

The core of the Rebels staff will remain intact for next season and the team has a strong young group ready to make a surge forward.
