press time, the Registrar's office reported an enrollment decrease of 1,600 students.

"This could cause UNLV real problems if we don't realize the projected enrollment. If our enrollment drops, our income drops, thus we end up with less money in our budget than we expected to make, and this would hurt the campus," he said.

A hiring freeze for the university is also in effect. According to Regent Shelly Berkeley, UNLV has exceeded its formula funding in previous years. In effect, the university has hired more faculty than needed for students. "As positions open, the university will be more selective in hiring," she said.

The administration announced a change in the evaluation process of itself. Provost Smith said that the administration felt it needed time to ensure an objective evaluation. "What I'm suggesting is these comprehensive evaluations be done every two to three years because it takes that long to learn about their job," Smith said.

"If there's one message that I would like to convey to the university is to give President (Carol) Harter and the new administrators a chance."

Action to lower student government VP's stipend tabled

Student gov't warned by attorney of possible breach of contract

A proposed Student Senate action to lower Vice President Joe Mills' stipend was tabled at Monday's meeting, due to fear of legal reprisals.

Attorney Shannon Bybee warned the Senate of a possible breach of contract if it voted to lower Mills stipend.

"I urge the student government to seek legal advice before taking action against Mills because he has a contract with the university," Bybee said. "If he is hurt financially he can take legal action for breach of contract."

Mills three-week long absence from the student gov-

ernment, due to a family emergency, spurred the original debate to lower his monthly stipend from \$750 to \$600. A

reduction to \$75 for August was also discussed.

"You can't function as a business if you don't pay your employees enough to survive," Mills said. "They're persecuting me...I brought the attorney so I wouldn't be alone in this room. It showed I was handling things professionally."

Senator Leia Fleischman,

who proposed both actions, said she wanted Mills to be accountable for his actions.

"Other than a coma or his own death, I couldn't understand why he couldn't call us. To me, it seemed like he wasn't performing his job,"

Fleischman said.

"Things were hampered and I think that's something that you can't let go by."

Several senators expressed sympathy for Mills and wanted to put the matter behind the student government. Mills said he felt that the Senate's handling of this matter was an indication of what was to come this year.

President John Pida concluded the Senate meeting with the following remarks:

"There are certain things I think should be done, one of them is not lowering his stipend that much. I come from a military background. If one would have done such an act, they would have seen correctional custody for like 60 days,

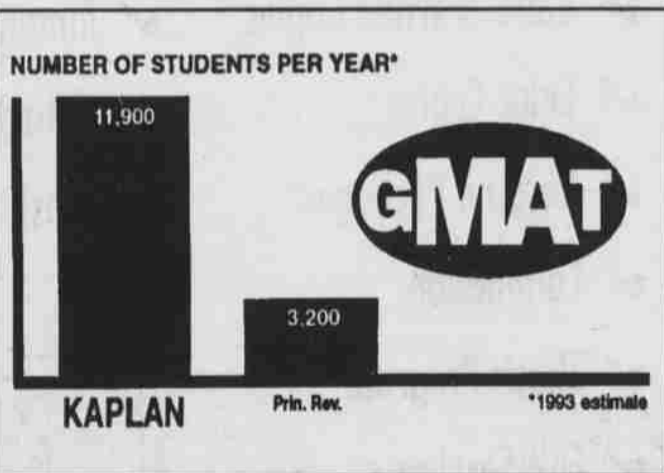
