
Lee is claiming that discriminatory remarks were made against him by Higgins and were heard by Knight. The remarks caused Lee to withdraw from UNLV and head to another school.


Knight hopes to be ranked in the top ten in the country this season. "I'm real excited about the upcoming season, I believe we're in a strong position to be successful," Knight said.
