"This is a matter of economics. The national debt is at \$6 trillion and it won't just go away. The debt is growing at a rapid pace. If we don't cut everywhere, if we don't reform certain programs that our federal government pays for, what will hurt in the long run is that Social Security, our national defense, Medicare, and any other welfare plans for the future, will go bankrupt. All of our tax money will go towards financing the debt. There will be no money for any kind of social services or national defense. It's simply a matter of economics. There are other ways to finance your education. Scholarships are avail-

able, as are part-time jobs. There are other options." At the conclusion of the rally, students dissipated while Berkley told reporters, "We have a large number of students on financial aid. This is the one opportunity they have to improve their lives." Sen. Titus said of the event, "There weren't a whole lot of people here, but people saw what was going on. You've got to start somewhere." Student response to the rally varied. Junior Ben Contine said, "It's important for diversity on this campus. It shouldn't be just high income people." Although freshman Don Ellis agrees with Contine regarding the need for financial aid, he said, "The point didn't get across to the students."

The Board Of Regents approved a name change for Northern Nevada Community College Sept. 8. The college's new name, Great Basin College, was selected to reflect its course offerings and service area. Great Basin College will offer upper division and graduate courses as well as continue its community college curriculum. The college covers five northern Nevada counties totaling 45,000 square miles.

UNLV offers 'Test Site 101'

UNLV's Harry Reid Center for Environmental Studies is presenting a course on the Nevada Test Site. "Environmental Issues at Nevada Test Site" will focus on alternative uses of the Nevada Test Site after more than 30 years of nuclear testing. The course is being offered to educate the community about proposed alternative land uses, hazards and clean up requirements. After completion of the course students will be able to make

their own decision regarding alternative uses. "Students will work through an actual case study of Plutonium-Contaminated soil at the Test Site, by applying the risk-determining parameters presented by their personal body and lifestyle types," said Dennis Weber, Reid Center environmental researcher and course co-presenter. The course costs \$61 and is being offered by the Department of Environmental Studies and the College of Education. It will meet from 6 to 9 p.m. Sept. 26 through Oct. 24 in the Barrick Museum of Natural History. The course offers one academic credit through the Division of Continuing Education or Environmental Studies program. Students also have the option to audit the course. 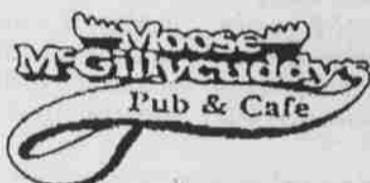
