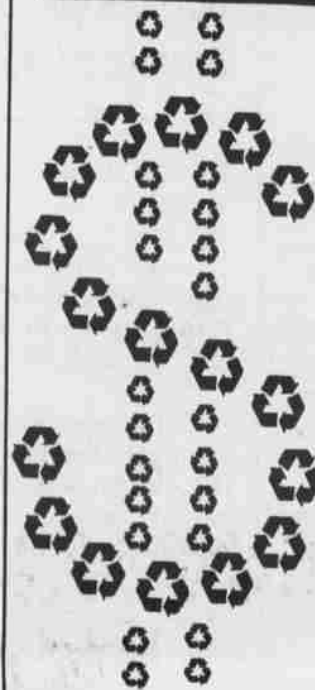
The sessions, which start at noon, are sponsored by and held in the Jean Nidetch Women's Center.

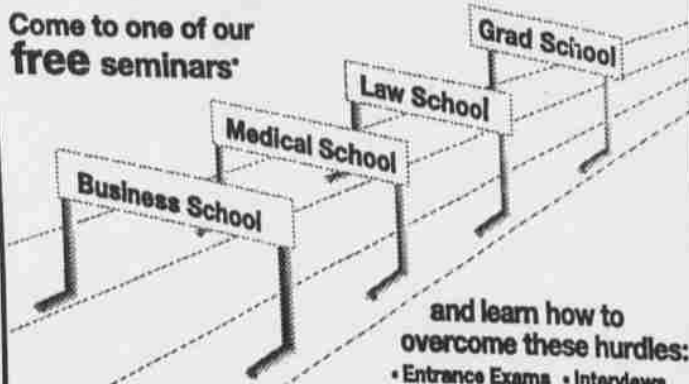
