Brewer's friend Cheryl Allen began the service by remembering their times together in and out of the classroom.

When I think about Randy I will remember the joyous times we spent together," Allen said.

Friend and sports information co-worker Scott Gulbransen remembered Brewer as a joy to be around.

"He was the kind of person who could light up the room with his smile," Gulbransen said. "Whenever I needed help Randy was there. No question about it. Randy Brewer exemplified what a human being should be like. He loved UNLV, he loved his family, he loved his friends, but more than anything he loved life itself."

In an emotional speech, Coach Jeff Horton remembered how Brewer was an inspiration to coaches and players alike.

"We want to remember the way Randy Brewer touched each and every one of our lives," Horton said. "He had the big smile-and the laugh. He was always saying something good and something positive in a sometimes negative world.

"No matter how down I might have been, he always made me feel good and would not let me stay down," he said.

Brewer, who started at UNLV as a walk-on to the football team, eventually earned a scholarship and a

starting job on the team. He started eight games last year including the games against the UNR Wolf Pack and the Las Vegas Bowl.

He had a big catch in the Bowl game against Central Michigan which preserved a drive and led to the go-ahead score. The win against UNR gave the Rebels a share of the Big West crown.

"He was a contender not a pretender. He knew what he wanted to do and set his mind to it and did it," Horton said. "I know he will always remember that special moment of winning the Big West Cham-pionship and the Las Vegas Bowl."

With one year of eligibility in football remaining, Brewer chose to pass up the playing field for the professional world. He landed himself a job in his hometown of Denver in the media relations department of the Denver Nuggets basketball team.

"He was the type of guy who exemplified what we want our student athletes to be like," Horton said. "He had his priorities right-he graduated in four years, got a job and did anything anyone ever asked of him. His character was outstanding.

"I was always Big Daddy but he was the Brew Crew, Horton said. "The Brew Crew will be with us for the rest of our lives.'

Tight end David White got to know Brewer while sharing time with him at the same position.

"It was fun to be a teammate of his," White said. "We

got to know each other real well. We were always helping each other out. We were a onetwo combination when we were playing together." Although White and Brew-

er competed for playing time, it was a situation where they both tried to make each other better.

'On any team you have two guys fighting it out for the same position,"White said. "It didn't matter who started, we were both just trying to win."

Funeral services will be held 10 a.m. Friday at New Hope Church in Denver. Horton, his wife Teri, UNLV tight end's coach Tom Nordquist and sports information director of football Mark Wallington will attend before flying to Iowa for Saturday's game against Iowa State.

The Rebels have dedicated their season to Brewer's memory and will wear black stickers on the back of every helmet with the initials "R.B."


