UNLV crowned champs with 20 stroke victory

The UNLV Golf squad demolished the competition this past weekend to capture a first place tournament championship in the Tucker Golf Classic at the University of New Mexico. After taking a demanding lead early on, the Rebels

played brilliant golf to easily win the 54 hole, par 72 tournament by an impressive 20 strokes. The Rebels placed two golfers in the top three of the final standings.

UNLV was paced by Gilberto Morales, who finished second overall in the tournament, shooting a 213 for the tournament.

Helping Morales take charge of the field, three other Rebels placed in the top 10.

Rebel All-American and Walker Cup representative Chris Riley had a strong outing in his first tournament of the year, finishing in a three-

way tie for third and shooting 215 for the tournament. On the second day of play, Riley shot a 68, 4 under par to place first on the leader board for that day.

Freshmen Ted Oh placed sixth in the tournament with a 216. Oh is an early favorite for Freshmen of the Year for college golf this season.

Mike Vance placed 10th with a 219 and Chad Campbell finished in a seven-way tie for 21st shooting a 224 to conclude the Rebels scoring.
