Cross Country finishes eighth in tournament

The UNLV cross country team was scheduled to run in the University of California, Irvine Invitational, but due to injuries the Rebel runners were forced to cancel the trip to Southern California.

The team got back on track and participated in the Spartan Invitational at Michigan State University, Saturday.

The competition was comprised of seven midwest schools and UNLV. The Rebels had the opportunity to get a good look at the top teams from the Big Ten Region: Ball State, Central Michigan, Hillsdale College, Indiana, Michigan State, Ohio State and Toledo. Even with this advantage, the Rebels finished eighth in the competition.

UNLV freshman, Michelle Henry, from Scarborough, Ontario placed 30th and was the Rebels' top finisher. Henry ran the 5,000 meters in 19 minutes, 25.89 seconds as UNLV finished last in the 8-team Spartan Invitational. Junior, Katie Durham, from Irvine, Calif. and sophmore Amy Carling, from Reno, finished within the top 40 runners.

UNLV Cross Country Head Coach Karen Dennis, a graduate of Michigan State University began her coaching career with the Spartans. After 11 seasons as the Head Coach of the women's track & field program, she accepted the position at UNLV. While at Michigan State, she guided her team to the 1982 Big Ten Conference Outdoor Track & Field Championship.

As the 1990 District IV Indoor Coach of the Year, she produced many outstanding athletes at MSU, including Judi Brown-King, 1984 Olympic silver medalist in the 400-meter, 12time BigTen champion Odessa Smalls, and 10,000-meter All-American and Big Ten champion Mary Shea.

from pg. 9 After being dominated in the first half, the Rebels showed some promise by scoring 30 points in a rally. The points were scored against Cyclone second and third teamers but Horton saw promise in the passing game.

"Our guys haven't quit all season," Horton said. "We play as hard as we can play for the whole game."

Three true freshman made their presence felt, accounting for 67 yards receiving. Carlos Baker caught 2 balls for 21 yards, Amar Brisco caught one for 21 yards and Damon Williams caught 2 balls for 35 yards.

"I was very impressed with their play," Horton said. "They did not drop any balls. It was good to see them have some success. If they keep improving we will be fine."

Fifth year senior Jack Gilmore, who had never caught a pass in his college career, caught seven balls for 62 yards.

with 50 seconds left in the first half. Senior Mark Valmore blocked a punt by ISU's Marc Harris to set up a oneyard run by Shannon Wilson. The Rebel's completed the twopoint conversion and trailed 34-8.

In the third quarter, UNLV had their first long touchdown drive of the afternoon. A seven play drive that spanned 72 yards was capped off by a 18yard touchdown pass form Brown to Tony Burton. The successful two point conversion made the score 44-16.

The Rebel's third touchdown was on a three-play drive that started at the ISU 36-yard line. The drive took 47 seconds and was keyed by tight end David White's 44-yard reception. Gilmore got the third score, a 18-yard pass

from Brown.

The final score of the game was a 21-yard pass to Brisco that finished an 86-yard 13 play drive. Williamshad a key catch on fourth down that preserved the drive.

UNLV lost it's tenth straight non-conference road game dating back to 1990. "We are trying to get better-

"We are trying to get better-I thought we played better this week," Horton said. "I don't ever feel sorry for myself or the team, we just need to get better.

UNLV is 1-3 on the season, but still holds a 1-0 record in conference play.

The Rebels will face Hawaii at home Saturday in a much needed return to Sam Boyd Stadium. The Rainbows lead the series 8-3 and kickoff will be at 7 p.m.
