We looked at all possible ways of cutting costs, Christenson said. When asked if pay reductions for directors were considered, he replied, "Not seriously. It would be difficult to look at just those people and not across the board. We had to look at the

ramifications of reducing everyone's salary vs. trimming the demand."

Christenson said it would take a lot of pay cuts to make up \$600,000, and it would be senseless to issue pay cuts when the real issue is the need to reduce the work force to match the demand. "We've been blessed with seasonal events in the last three years. We needed more people to run the events. There isn't a need for that now because we don't have enough big events."
