Moliere's "The Misanthrope" opens University Theatre's 95-96 theater season tonight at 8 p.m. in the Judy Bayley The-

Directed by Michael Lugering, this classic 17th century French comedy is a piece that portrays French society of the period as extremely elegant, formal, and mannered. The superficial elegance of the verse reflects the contrived manners of society: One that is polished, artificial, and ritualistic.

Alceste, the hero of the play, is disgusted with society, corruption, and his two-faced friends. Celimene, whom Alceste loves, is the epitome of all that disgusts him, but her smiles and praises, (two-faced as they are) entrance him.

A love triangle evolves as Alceste falls in love with Celimene, the one who is not interested in being faithful to him, yet shuns Eliante, a woman that would be better suited for him.

Joel Babbitt plays Alceste and Curtis C. performs the role of his friend Philinte. The role of Celimene is played by Michell Caudel and Eliante is performed by Kelly Roth.

Addition cast members include Jason Johnson, Kathryn Ambler, Michael Serna, Glenn Peters, Greg Gaskill, Alister Logan, and Brian Anderson.
