

Protesters march on federal building

In a show of solidarity echoed nationwide, UNLV students joined protesters who marched in front of the Foley Federal Building Monday

night to express opposition to a proposed amendment excluding gay rights from the Colorado Constitution.

The change in the constitution will go before the Supreme Court Wednesday.

The protest drew many residents, including UNLV students, members of the National Organization of Women, and culinary workers.

Community leaders including former Nevada legislator, Lorie Lipman Brown and gay political activist, Lee Plotkin spoke to the crowd.

"Our founding fathers meant for our country to be a constitutional democracy and not a pure democracy and if this wave of 'family values' platforms also means taking people's jobs away and forcing them from their homes, then we need to fight to get involved in a movement for civil rights until all peoples are guaranteed equal rights," Brown said.
