Theatre drew in 1,000,000 ticket-holding guests to a variety of events last year. This figure excludes campus visitors who attended university events for which no ticket was necessary for admittance.

"There's quite a bit of activity out here at night," Drake said. "Had we charged \$2 for each of those cars to park in our lots, we could have generated \$2,000,000 additional dollars last year," Drake added

The solution, Drake says, is to purchase automated permit dispensers. The machines are available to the university at a cost of \$5,000 each, and would be situated for convenience to visitors at various locations on campus. Drake anticipates five machines being purchased if this project is implemented.

The construction of additional staffed booths, identical to the one located at the university entrance on Harmon, is another alternative to free nighttime parking, said Drake. Staffing of visitor booths would cost approximately \$18,000 annually, while the construction of the booths would cost an additional \$15,000.

Quick fixes and repairs may be seen as soon as this summer to improve parking conditions, Drake said, but administrators agree that the construction of a parking garage is not in UNLV's immediate future.

Entries are being accepted for the 1996 Hydro Power Contest, which offers thousands of dollars worth of scholarships, cash and prizes to the winners.


