## Rebels tennis crowned champs

UNLV tennis in command of opponents on home court

The 36th-ranked UNLV men's tennis team played stingy hosts, as they denied the competition en route to capturing the UNLV Invitational title this past weekend at the Frank and Vicki Fertitta Tennis Complex.

Led by contributions from every player, the Rebels (3-2) shut out Utah State in the opening round 7-0, then cruised by the University of Oklahoma in the semifinals 6-1. Then

they defeated the University of Colorado 4-1 to capture the tournament.

Against the Aggies of Utah State, the Rebels rested 17thranked singles star Roger Pettersson, leaving Pettersson's double partner Luke Smith in the No. 1 singles position.

Smith responded with a straight set, 6-2, 6-2 victory over Aggie Dave Perry. The Rebels received points

from the remainder of the singles roster, and captured the doubles point to close out the 7-0 shut-out, pushing them into the tournament semi-finals against Oklahoma, who shut-out Weber State 7-0.

Back from his one match rest, Pettersson paced the Rebels as he won in No. 1 singles by defeating Sooner Marek Medonos 6-4, 6-4.

UNLV accumulated points from the singles victories of Smith, Tim Blenkiron, Asaf Tishler, and Dominic Boulet. They proceeded to sweep all three doubles matches, earning them their final point in the 6-1 domination of the Soon-

Next up for the Rebels, 47thranked University of Colorada, who defeated defending tournament champions Tulsa

5-2, on the way to the finals. Pettersson led the squad with a straight set victory, 6-2, 6-2 over 56th-ranked Marc Bauer. Smith and Boulet also had straight set wins in the tournament finale.

The Rebels also took two doubles matches with Pettersson/Blenkiron and Smith/ Tishler both coming away with Rebel wins.

The match was called once the Rebels picked up their fourth point to clinch the tournament championship.

The Rebels will be in action again on Friday, when they host New Mexico State and then again on Sunday, hosting San Jose State at the Fertitta Tennis Complex.


