existing college such as Environmental Studies, Gerontology and Women's Studies.

The committee rejected a request to turn the Greenspun School of Communication into a free-standing college.

Harter stressed the recommendations are in the preliminary stages and said faculty concerns would be addressed before any of the proposed changes were made.

"It is important to our dialogue about reorganization that it be understood at the outset that the committee's report is not an action document," Harter said in a memo to university faculty and administrators. "The committee has provided us with a working draft of proposed concepts for consideration and discussion."

To complete its proposal, the committee followed several steps. First, they reviewed UNLV's organizational and demographic data. The committee looked at current organizational charts, college's budget information and the number of academic programs, faculty, students and degrees offered by each pro-

Second, the committee studied the organizational charts of 10 other universities.


Third, they studied the restructuring efforts of other universities to review the pros and cons of the efforts, and how they fit in with UNLV's reorganization efforts.

Fourth, the committee conducted interviews with approximately 40 UNLV staff, vice presidents, deans, chairs and head of programs to solicit suggestions concerning the reorganization.

Finally, two campus-wide faculty forums were conducted on the reorganization is-

"Our hope is that the plan that ultimately emerges from this proposal will improve academic, administrative, and budgetary efficiency, all of which will help us achieve our goal of better serving UNLV students," Ferraro said.
