phony, comprised of woodwinds, brass, percussion and strings, has been under Leslie's direction for the last 10 years. Also a director of the UNLV band program, he has earned national recognition for his groups' excellent performances.

When Leslie is not busy teaching classes in conducting and instrumental music education on campus, he is an adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor throughout the U.S. and Canada. Under Leslie's guidance, the wind symphony has been featured at the Band Directors national Association Conferences and has toured extensively in England, Scotland and Japan.

Conductor Suzuki is an accomplished musician with a broad background in orchestra and wind symphony direction. He is currently a professor of music and teaches music education and conducting at UNLV.

Sano graduated first in his class from the Musashino Music Academy. Since then, he has gone on to become an accomplished solo performer. He currently tours as a soloist, orchestral performer and chamber musician.

Certain selections from the evening's concert were recorded for future use on the University Wind Symphony's next compact disc, scheduled for release later this year.

The symphony's first CD, *The University Wind Symphony 1994*, was released in the fall of that year, and received high accolades for its content and style.

very affordable," he said.

As the name indicates, they do serve Kimchee, made in the traditional way, which includes Pa chu (Korean cabbage), hot chili peppers, and garlic.

For those that don't like the sour, spicy cabbage, don't wor-

ry; it's only served as a side-dish (\$1.45).

Very interesting and delicious is Kimchee Hut's version of teriyaki sauce. Hak Kim described this Korean-style sauce, although similar in taste, as "healthier than the traditional sauce, with less sugar and fat."

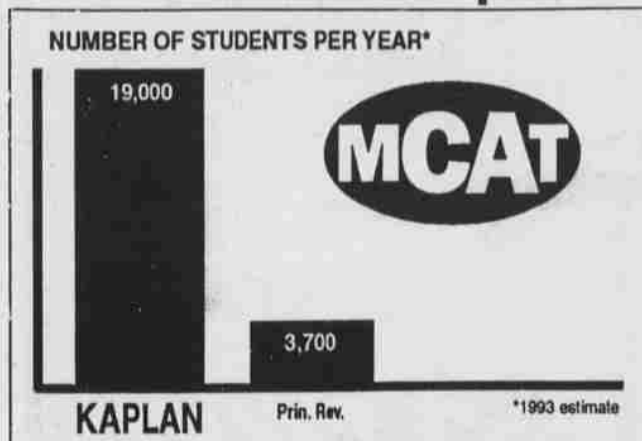
"For those who have never heard of Kimchee Hut, think of it as Benihana's, only about \$35 cheaper," said Bob High-
