right? No rules exist on this subject, but some tactics are better than others, Terneus said.

Direct communication is best, she addede. Telling someone the relationship is over in a face-toface setting is preferable to avoiding the person and hoping they get the hint.

According to Terneus, the loss of that stability from ending a relationship can be frightening. The best way to deal with post-relationship blues, Terneus said, is to communicate.

"Talking about it is the best way of dealing with the grief," she said. "Get interested in things you did before the relationship. Finally, do

not try to force recovery. Take your time and go at your own pace."

Some people fantasize about asking their exmate to revive the relationship after a break up, Terneus said. In counseling, Terneus helps people rebuild

themselves to the person they were before the relationship. This can help people realize why the relationship did not work out.

Student Psychological Services offers counseling for couples and individuals. "Counseling is not a magic band-aid to fix years and months of miscommunication and inaccurate assumptions," she said.
