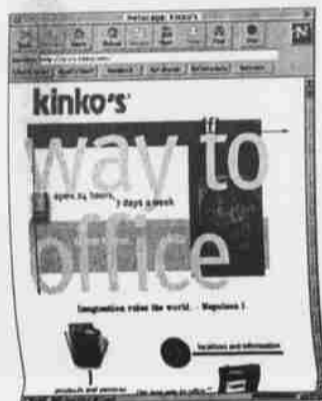

## Rebels find out who's the boss in volleyball

There was no way a person could tell the match was being played on the UNLV campus.

Clad in green shirts, green face paint, chanting "Wahines" and toting sugar cane leaves, the University of Hawai'i faithful made Friday's matchup seem like an away game for the Rebels.

The 1,251 in attendance saw the Rebels (4-11, 2-3 WAC) play some of their most inconsistent volleyball all season as they dropped the match in three straight, 15-2, 15-8, 15-0. Of the 1,251 at the South Gym, approximately 1,000 fans were for the No. 1-ranked Rainbow Wahines. However, Head Coach Deitre Collins believes that fans were not that much of a factor in UNLV's loss.

"When you're playing in a match like that you really can't tell who the fans are for," Collins said. "Until that last point I don't think our players really knew who was there. That's no reason for why we played like we did, though."

The Rebels had some momentum going against the top-ranked Rainbow Wahines (19-0, 8-0 in the WAC) in the second game when they were up 7-1. With the help of UH errors, the Rebels had just three sideouts to set their lead. But it wasn't enough as the Wahines had a four-point run to make it 7-5, then through two sideouts ran up another eight points to pull ahead and eventually crush the Rebels' hope of stealing a match from the defending WAC champions.

"We worked hard to get that lead (in the second game)," Collins said. "And we have told our players before that if we play well and get a lead a good team is definitely

going to come back, and Hawai'i's a good team. The bad thing that happened is that we stopped doing what got us to those points and I think that's just immaturity and not understanding how the game works."

The Wahines wore down the Rebels in the final game with UNLV forcing just five sideouts en route to being shutout in the final game. Coming out of the break it looked like the Rebels were unable to adjust to the changes the Wahine's made and that proved to be the final ordeal for UNLV.

"I think we just gave up (in the final game)," Collins explained. "I think they freaked out when we changed some things and didn't adjust. Maybe it's my fault and we should've stuck with what we did in game two. We tried some different things in the third game and none of them seem to work."

The Rebels' effort was most evident in the final stats of the game where no Rebel was in double figures in any of the triple-double categories (kills, assists and digs). Meri-de Boyer led the Rebels with nine assists while Christel Eves had just four kills, leading all Rebel attackers.

The Rebels dropped their fourth straight on Saturday when they lost to San Diego State 15-8, 15-1, 15-5. Wendy Saxton, who had been in the substitute roll for most of the season, stepped up and had 13 assists and five digs for UNLV, which led the team for the match. Boyer had eight kills and Danielle Gerlach had seven for the struggling Rebels.

Next up for the Rebels will be a road trip to three WAC schools. They will face Wyoming on Friday, Colorado State on Saturday and then the Air Force Academy on Oct. 31.
