Rebels can't dig way out of Wyoming missed her sixth triple-double as she

When UNLV's volleyball team was told they had to dig more, they figured that meant on the volleyball court, not in the snow.

The Rebels were slated to fly to Fort Collins, Colo., to face Colorado State Saturday but heavy snow in Laramic, Wyo, prevented that from happening. Instead, the game was postponed until Sunday.

It looked like the Rebels were using snow shovels to dig balls against the Cowgirls as they came up with 83 digs in the match, three shy of the school record set back in 1985.

The Rebels (4-14, 2-6 in the WAC) lost to both Wyoming (15-11, 15-12, 12-15, 15-9) and Colorado State (15-5, 15-12, 15-7)

over the weekend despite hindering snowfall.

Meri-de Boyer notched her fifth triple-double of the season against the Cowgirls, finishing the match with 12 kills, 14 assists and 16 digs. UNLV had five players with 10 or more digs in the match-Kim DeWitt (16), Danielle Gerlach (13), Kendra Wilkinson (11) and Wendy Saxton (10)-and still the Rebels couldn't

pull out the road victory.

Saxton also finished up with 11 assists and Christel Eves had 11 kills against the Cowgirls.

In Fort Collins, the Rams pounded the Rebels with 51 total kills and 10 team blocks. For Colorado St., Rainie Rogers had 16 kills to lead all players while Janie Penfield and Judy Rexroth both netted 13 kills.

For the Rebels, Boyer narrowly

finished with nine assists to add to her 13 assists and 14 kills. Christy Clark also had a strong game for the scarlet and grey as she netted 17 assists and 11 digs.

UNLV will be in action again on Thursday as they travel to Colorado Springs to face the Air Force Academy. The Rebels will be back home on Saturday to battle Tulsa at 7:30 p.m. in the South Gym.
