Swimmer Harewood honored


The UNLV athletic department announced that former UNLV men's swimmer Seun Harewood was honored as a recipient of the Arthur Ashe Jr. 1996-97 Sports Scholar Award, in recognition of outstanding academic and athletic achievement.
