Rebels split two over weekend

The UNLV soccer team had a good weekend, when they took one out of two games in the UNLV Snickers/Fila Rebel Classic. They opened the tournament on Friday with a loss to Kentucky, 2-1, but then came back strong with a victory against Michigan State University on Sunday afternoon.

Sunday's game was an important one for UNLV in many ways. They needed to prove to themselves that they are good enough to compete in Division I play and are able to show themselves and their fans that they can win at home. And most importantly, they needed to prove that they can score goals.

They did those things with a great deal of success on Sunday with a big 4-2 victory over Michigan State. The Rebels' four goals were the more than they scored in any one game last season.

The scoring began on a UNLV penalty kick just 20:54 into the match. The kick was converted by Kiko Medina for his first goal of the year.

However, Michigan State countered with a goal with just 35 seconds left in the first half, to take the wind out of the Rebels' sails, and tie the game at one going into halftime.

The second half is where the UNLV offense exploded. The scoring began with a spectacu-lar unassisted goal from Medina, his second of the game.

The Rebels were not done, scoring again at 71:55 on a goal from Gergely Kokavecz, his first, off a pass from Michael Griego, to give the Rebels a twogoal lead.

Just three minutes later, UNLV was on the board again with a goal from Robbie Adams, and an assist from Geoff Barto. MSU countered with a late goal, but that was not enough, as the Rebels broke a five-game home losing streak.

"We found a way to win," Head Coach Barry Barto said after the victory. "The players






have to do it, not the coaches. We need to build confidence that we can score goals. Otherwise the team thinks that we will never score. A lot of it is psychological."

On Friday night, the Rebels lost 2-1 to the University of Kentucky. UNLV had a lead after a quick goal by Griego, but gave up two penalty kick goals to the Wildcats and lost the game in overtime.

The Rebels will be in action this Thursday as they take on California State San Bernardino at Peter Johann Memorial Field at 7:00 PM.
