Denton returns after 2 game suspension

In their final road game of the season, the Rebels look to win their first WAC road game in history and break their 18game road losing streak. The Rebels get sophomore quarterback Jon Denton back from his two-game suspension, and will look to him to get them back on the winning track. After losing to Colorado State at home last Saturday in a blowout, 45-19, the Rebels head to Wyoming to take on the Cowboys. The Cowboys are coming off an impressive victory against San Diego State last weekend, as they drubbed the Aztecs 41-17. The Cowboys hold a 6-4 overall record (3-2 WAC) compared to the Rebels' 3-6 record (2-4 WAC). UNLV's three-game los-


ing streak has dropped them from third in the WAC to seventh. went down for the season

Last year's game against the Cowboys was a big day for Denton. He threw for a singlegame NCAA freshman record 486 yards, and added three touchdowns, but fell to Wyoming 33-21.

Sophomore running back Coury Hankins has been a pleasant surprise for the Rebels since star recruit Rodrick Johnson went down for the season against Hawaii in Game Three. He has run for 100 yards in four games this season, the 11th Rebel to do so. He grabbed his latest 100 yard output against Colorado State last week as he scampered for 104 yards.

Junior wide receiver Damon Williams keeps adding to his streak, as he has now caught a pass in every game he has played in his career. His streak stands now at 32 games as he caught eight passes against CSU last weekend.

Two injuries to report are offensive lineman Ben Glidewell who sprained his ankle, and defensive lineman Derrick Monroe who sprained his knee. They are both listed as probable for this week's matchup.

Last time they met (September 28, 1996) - UNLV improved as a team for the fifth time in as many games this season but still fell short and lost to WAC-leading Wyoming in front of 12, 564 at Sam Boyd Stadium. The Rebels were led by a recordsetting performance by freshman quarterback Jon Denton and almost the Cowboys, who were favored by at least 30 points. Denton, who threw for a singlegame NCAA freshman record 486 yards, found senior Omar Love three times for scores to give UNLV its first lead of the season at 21-20 with 10 minutes left in the third quarter. The Rebels rolled up 543 yards on offense but twice failed to score any points after reaching the Cowboy 10-yard line.
