The last time these two heavyweights got together, Moorer and his dominating left-hand ate Holyfield alive.


Holyfield continuously moved to his right, and Moorer's left jab was always there to greet him. If Holyfield doesn't change this style, history will again repeat itself.

have been muttering since they were eliminated from postseason play by losing two games on the road last weekend. With the losses, the Rebel's record dropped to 5-10-2 overall and 2-4-1 in the Western Athletic Conference.

They came into the weekend with a legitimate shot of making the WAC Tournament but with back-to-back losses to New Mexico and Air Force, all hopes were ended.

The weekend began in New Mexico where the Rebels were shutout 3-0 by the Lobos. New Mexico (13-5, 4-2) took an early 2-0 lead by the 27th minute and never looked back. The Rebels gave up another goal at the 76:50 mark and never were able to get on the scoreboard. It was the fourth time that UNLV had been scoreless this season.

Then the Rebels traveled to the Air Force Academy and took on one of the best soccer teams in the nation in the Falcons. Air Force (13-2, 5-1) jumped all over the Rebels in the first half and took a 3-0 lead into half-

This weekend the Rebels will officially conclude their season when they take on Tulsa on Sunday at Peter Johann Memorial Field. The Golden Hurricanes are currently 11-6 overall and 4-2 in the WAC. They are tied with New Mexico for third place in the WAC. The top four teams in the WAC make it to the WAC Tournament.

They are all starters and will be sorely missed next year. Goalkeeper Dan Abdalla, who holds the Rebel record for most career saves, Derek Rensing, who has two goals and one assist this season, and Ryan Utsman, who completed his third strong season at defender for the Rebels.
