LADY REBELS SWEEP IN DOUBLES

The 42nd-ranked UNLV women's tennis team lost all three of its doubles matches to allow No. 35 San Diego to come back for a 5-4 home victory on Saturday.

The Rebels, who fell to 8-10 overall, won four of six singles points to take a commanding 4-2 lead entering the double portion of the match.

However, San Diego swept all three singles points to come away victorious.

Gee Gee Garvin won her match in No. 1 singles 6-1, 6-1 and Susie Kocsis was victorious in No. 2 singles, 6-0, 2-6, 7-6. Veronica Goude also won her singles match, picking up a 6-4, 7-5 win in No. 3 singles action.

Marcella Valkenhoff posted a 7-6, 6-1 win in No. 6 singles for UNLV's final point.

The Lady Rebels closed out their regular season schedule on Sunday with a match at No. 27 San Diego State. This match was played after the *Yell* went to press.

UNLV RESPONDS TO BUDGET ISSUE

There is no deficit in the UNLV Athletic Department's budget for the 1998-99 fiscal year, according to UNLV's Assistant Athletics Director for Administration Tom Gabbard.

UNLV is preparing a balanced budget and is only in its preliminary stages of the process," Gabbard said in a press release. "This process happens every year and it is not at all unusual for preliminary projected needs and wants to exceed projected revenues. I have never seen a preliminary budget that was balanced."

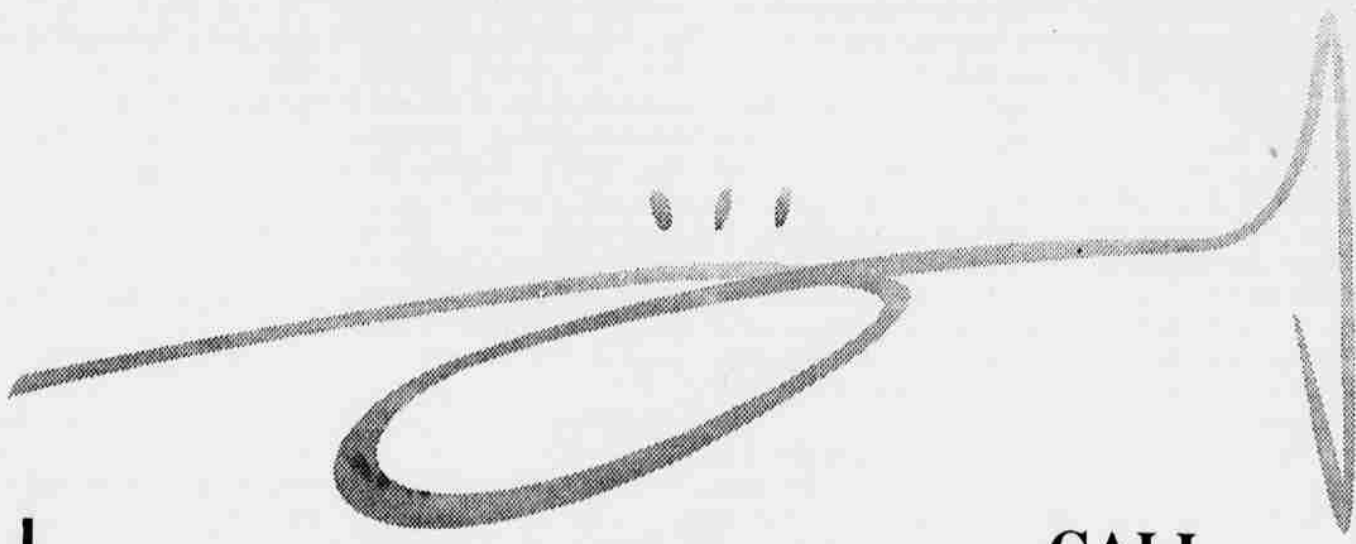
There are many rules and regulations to the budget process.

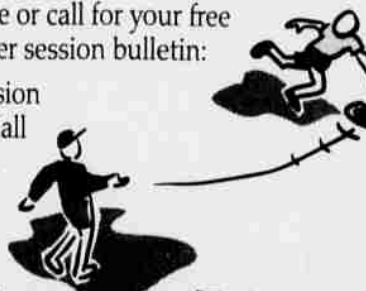
