UNLV DOUBLES PLAY HURTS

The 42nd ranked Lady Rebels played the 27th ranked Aztecs from San Diego State. For the second day in a row UNLV lost all the doubles.

The match on Sunday concluded UNLV's regular season, and WAC play. The Lady Rebels fell to 8-11 overall for the season and 1-2 in the WAC while the Aztecs improved their record to 12-4, and 4-1 in the WAC.

UNLV came out of the singles matches with a 3-3 split. Winning for UNLV were Gee Gee Garvin, at the top spot, who defeated number 77, Maggie Cole, 6-0, 5-7, 7-6. Also winning were Veronica Goude at the second spot and Marcella Valkenhoff at the fifth spot.

In the doubles matches UNLV's play deteriorated. San Diego State swept the Lady Rebels, winning all the matches 8-6, 8-4, and 8-2.

With the three doubles wins, the Aztecs pulled away from the Lady Rebels to win the match 6-3.

SOFTBALL SPLITS WITH SAN DIEGO STATE

On April 21st the Lady Rebels squared off in a double header with San Diego State at the Rebel Diamond on the

UNLV campus.

The Aztecs were no match for the Lady Rebels in the first game. The Lady Rebels improved their record to 16-22 with the win over the Aztecs.

The game was almost devoid of offense with no runs scored in the first 5 and 1/2 innings. But in the bottom of the sixth, the Lady Rebels came through to score the game's only run and pull ahead of the Aztecs 1-0.

The Aztecs could not answer in the top of the seventh and the Lady Rebels did not have to bat in the bottom of the seventh as the game was already won.

Pitching for the Lady Rebels was Brandi Isgar, who pitched a complete game and struck out six while only walking one.

In the second game the Aztecs came alive and pounded the Lady Rebels 9-1. The Aztecs had 16 hits compared to the Lady Rebels two.

The Aztec pitching was almost identical to the Lady Rebel pitching of the first game. Sandra Durazo pitched a complete game for the Aztecs, striking out eight, while only walking two.

With the loss the Lady Rebels dropped to 16-23 for the season.

Rice, the Rebels will return home for a two-game set with the aforementioned Horned Frogs of TCU. They will finish up the WAC season with a series at New Mexico.

Another series for Rebels fans to keep their eye on this weekend will be San Jose St. at San Diego St. Those are the two teams that the Rebels are fighting with for the playoff spots.

"We're just going to take care of our business and let them beat up on each other," Coach Soesbe said.

Several players on the Rebels continue to have exceptional years. Third baseman Kevin Eberwein has been exceptional hitting .366, with 10 home runs and 41 RBI.

Catcher Ryan Hamill leads the team with 11 home runs. He is also batting .333 and has knocked in 32 runs.

Outfielder Ryan Ludwick leads the team with 476 RBIs. He is hitting .364 and has hit 10 out of the ballpark.

The team leader in batting average is catcher Brad Beasley, who is hitting .455 in his five starts this year.

The leader among starters is first baseman Tony DeMarco who is hitting at a .396 clip. DeMarco also has six home runs and 38 RBIs.

Two pitchers have picked up five wins this year. Mike Zipser is 5-4 with a 5.21 ERA. Jerimiah Tipton is 5-1 with a 5.19 ERA.

Jimmy Smith, the closer leads the team with a 2.81 ERA to go along with his seven saves in 22 appearances.

The Rebels may have trouble with the highly ranked Owls in Houston. The Rebels did defeat Rice one out of the three times they played earlier this year, but taking one in Houston would be a steal.

The real must-win games will then be next week when they host three games at Wilson Stadium against TCU.

That series will be Friday-Sunday, May 1-3.

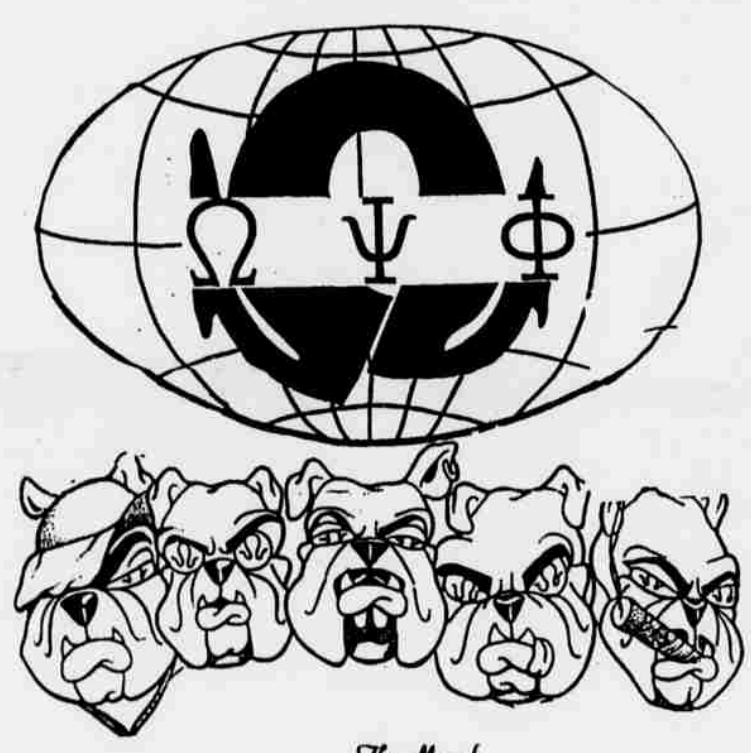
