Former UNLV student opens art exhibit at CCSN

Doug Travis' art exhibit, The

Books, is currently open to the public at the Community College of Southern Nevada (CCSN) Art Gallery and runs through Sept. 30. On Sept. 29, there will be a workshop at noon in room 2208, a lecture in the gallery from 5 to 6 p.m. and a closing reception from 6 to 8 p.m.

The Books includes a collection of Travis' handmade books and installations from 1995 to this year.

"Most of us discover mail long before postage," says Travis. "The early mail, when we draw a line on a page and hand it to a parent, is about exploring communication through creativity. In time, our mail becomes a kind of proof, the personal and professional signature of ourselves. It conveys a summary of our experience and evidence of our commitment."

Travis feels these books and installations are made with the same sensibility. "I have always depended on mail," he continues, "not only for the usual purpose of communication, but for the promises that I find there.


