JERUSALEM, (JTA)-- Israel's Knesset (Parliament), by a vote of 54 to 26, supported Premier Levi Eshkol's rejection of West Germany's offer of monetary compensation for breaking Bonn's previous agreement to supply arms to Israel, and declared that "the recent developments demand that Israel reconsider its relations with Germany."

Summarizing the debate in the Knesset that followed his presentation of the case against Bonn, Mr. Eshkol expressed his appreciation of "the unity of the house in its condemnation of German surrender to Egyptian blackmail," and declared; "The Knesset would like to see a continuation of relations between us and Germany, based on our demands. Germany's action is one of surrender to pressure, and may cause the breakdown of our bridge

-- a fact that would force us to look for ways to rehabilitate the relationship."

In its motion, the Knesset resolved as follows: "We express shock and anger over the intention to stop security assistance to Israel."

After declaring that the development requires re-consideration of Israeli-German relations, the resolution continued: "We support the Government of Israel in its demand that West Germany continue its earlier agreement (for supply of arms to Israel). Financial compensation does not release the German Government from its obligations."

"The people of Israel and its Knesset are encouraged by the identification with her security needs expressed by the Jewish people and by world public opinion in their protests to Germany against the German Government's surrender to the blackmail by the ruler of Egypt."

"IS REFORM JUDAISM OPPOSED TO THE DIETARY LAWS?"

From time to time people still wonder "what kind of a Rabbi is Rabbi Gold?". They express their wonder in many ways. Some think that because our Temple kitchen is now fully Kosher, therefore Rabbi Gold must be an Orthodox Rabbi. Others have maintained that since I am using the Reform Ritual for placing the Mezuzah on the door, I must be a Reform Rabbi. However I must emphasize again and again, that though I am affiliated with the Conservative Rabbinate,

as our Temple is affiliated with the Conservative movement, I believe wholeheartedly in Judaism without a label.

I believe that all three movements in Judaism have contributed towards the growth of American Jewish Life. However, I, as Rabbi of Temple Beth Sholom, reserve the freedom to take from each, that which is most significant and applicable for our people's spiritual growth.

DELINQUENCY'S HELPMEET

There was a terrible accident up in Darien, Conn., this summer. On a summer's night, after a fashionable party, a young girl was killed in a car smashup. Her escort was unconscious for a few days. The police charged he was driving under the influence of alcohol. At his trial, the young man pleaded not that he was sober but that he wasn't driving.

"And where did you get the liquor?" asked the outraged judge.

"At the party," said the young fellow.

The judge interrupted this sad but ordinary trial and ordered the arrest of the

adults who had sponsored the party, charging them under an old Connecticut statute which forbids the serving of alcohol to minors not one's own.

The shocked parents protested. The party was well-behaved, no different than a thousand other parties that take place for youngsters over the summer. Many of the guests were over the legal age limit for alcoholic consumption; certainly those under 21 had had liquor before.

Nazis Not Through Yet

VIENNA, (JTA)-- Informed sources said here that the Austrian Government will probably act soon to extend the effective date of the statute of limitations for the prosecution of all Nazi war criminals. The sources said that the extension will be based on a revival of an Austrian law which stipulated there was no limitation for crimes that carried the death penalty. Although the death penalty has since been abolished, plans call for revival of the law and both coalition parties have announced they considered such a procedure possible.
