Judge Zenof never neglected his civic obligations towards our community. He served as president of Las Vegas Kiwanis Club, and is an active member of the Elks, the American Legion and Marine Corps League, having served in that branch of active duty during the war years of 1943 to 1946.

Being a man who never takes anything in life lightly. Judge Zenoff even assumed a serious role for his favorite hobby - boxing. He be-came licensed by the Nevada State Athletic Commission as a boxing judge, and many of his decisions have been determining factors in nemdetermining factors in naming world champions who have fought for the title here in Las Vegas.
