### Editorial FORGIVE GERMANS???

It isn't a pleasant sight to see grown men cry, but adults of the Jewish Faith all over the world are shedding many tears over circumstances that have come to light in the past several months.

The setback, to be sure is temporary, in the form of unrelated incidents which serve only to deter and hinder the tremendous strides being accomplished in the last decade to minimize and erase anti-Semitism and religious bias. It proves there is a pendulum at the highest level, perhaps God's, which seeks to slow up any movement, even the most righteous, from traveling too fast in any one direction.

One of the setbacks is a most disturbing thought in the form of a Look magazine article, written no less, by an American Rabbi, who asks: "Isn't It Time We Forgive The Germans?"

Answering the query, was our first reaction, would only tend to lend dignity to it. We chose to weep silently at the very thought. But too many related items are taking place at this same psychological time, and so we'll attempt to control our emotions as we give logical response to this horrendous suggestion.

Germany permitted a demented regime to systematically annihilate millions of human beings. Without cause, without reason, without distinction and without justification, the lives of 6,000,000 persons were erased, with millions more to follow were it not for the intervention of armed forces from other nations. The German citizens did absolutely nothing to protest this wholesale mass murdering. There was not a single underground movement afoot to combat the demented regime.

The plea of the individual German now, is that he did not know what was going on. This is extremely hard to believe. Every person in Germany knew the Jews were being hunted down and carted off to concentration camps. Everyone there saw the abuse being heaped on the Jews, the crude signs "JUDE," on Jewish business establishments, the harassment in public and in the homes. The indignities were manifold and every man, woman and child was aware of the circumstances.

Although every individual German may not have actually seen the operation of the gas chambers, the stench of dead bodies was evident for miles around and should have given reason for some investigation. The German

ATHENS, Ohio, (JTA) -- George Lincoln Rockwell, leader of the American Nazi Party, addressed 2,800 students of Ohio University here and was subjected to derisive laughter. He then complained that he had "a totally different reception here than at any other of the 40 or 50 schools where I have spoken."

Rockwell had been invited to the campus by the residents of Bush Hall, a men's dormitory, as part of a program to raise money for a scholarship fund. University

officials had refused requests by some students and faculty members, as well as by Jacob Mirviss, director of the Hillel Foundation here, to bar his appearance.
