JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM, (JTA) -- Premier Levi Eshkol, in a pointed reference to West German delay in ratifying diplomatic relations between West Germany and Israel, said Isreal "expected that Bonn would not indulge in petty dealings" in acting on the matter. He made the comment to a group of visiting West German journalists.

JERUSALEM, (JTA) -- Dr. Hahum Goldmann urged Israel to enlist world Jewry in a joint effort to use "the breach in the wall of Arab policy" ereated by Tunisian President Habib Bourguiba's "daring" statements urging the Arab states to recognize and negotiate with Israel for peace. The World Zionist leader said the content of the Tunisian President's proposals was unimportant because the time had not yet arrived for concrete proposals. But, he added the significance of the proposals was perhaps historical in that for the first time a recognized Arab leader had taken a stand envisaging a peaceful settlement of the Arab-Israel conflict.

STRASBOURGE, (JTA) -- The Council of Europe, which serves as an unofficial European Parliament of 21 countries called during its regular session here on the Soviet Government to accord equal religious, cultural and communal rights to the 3,000,000 Jews in Russia. The Council said in a resolution that "there is a European responsibility towards the Jewish people." It urged the Soviet Union to "accord to the Jewish community the religious and cultural rights guaranteed to all religious and ethnic groups by articles 123 and 124 of the Constitution of the USSR."

BRUSSELS, (JTA) -- A resolution urging the Soviet Union to grant full rights to Jews in the USSR, providing for the Russian Jews treatment in all fields equal to the privileges granted all other nationaltities in the Soviet Unior, was adopted at the conclusion of a four-day meeting held by the World Union of Jewish Students.

NEW YORK, (JTA) -- A mass meeting, sponsored by the New York Conference on Soviet Jewry, a body composed of 28 local and national Jewish organizations, will be held on June 3 at Madison Square Garden here to protest the suppression of religious and cultural freedom of Soviet Jewry, it was announced by Label Katz, chairman of the American Jewish Conference of Soviet Jewry.

WASHINGTON, (JTA) -- Sen. George Murphy, California Republican, called on chairman J. W. Fulbright of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to help bring forth a favorcommittee report on the Ribicoff resolution, condemning Soviet anti-Semitism "at the earliest possible time."

BRUSSELS, (JTA) -- A prediction that the Spanish Government would soon follow its recognition of the Madrid Jewish community with similar legal status for the Jews of other Jewish communities in Spain was made by Max Mazin, president of the Madrid community.

BONN, (JTA) -- The Bundestag, the lower house of West Germany's Parliament, will consider this month an amendment to provide individual compensation for victims of Nazism who were trapped in Iron Curtain countries and could not file claims before the 1953 deadline.

LONDON, (JTA) -- A bill to outlaw racial discrimination in Britain, which would also prohitib discrimination or incitement against Jews, passed a second reading in the House of Commons by a majority of 12 votes for the Labor Government. The bill is Britain's first attempt at laws against such discrimination.

RIO DE JANEIRO, (JTA) -- Sharp condemnation of anti-Semitic manifestations that have recently increased in Recife, capital of Brazil's northeastern State of Pernambuco, was voiced here in the National Assembly by Rep. Andrade Lima Filho, a member of the Parliament's opposition party.

Then, two years ago, the entire family - father, mother, ten dependent children and four married sons and daughters with their own families - came to Israel. They were settled in Dimona, a boom town on the barren plateau east of Beersheba, All that is, but Avner. Soon after their arrival, a welfare worker met with the family to discuss Avner's situation.

Avner was sent north, to the rehabilitation center operated by Malben, the Joint Distribution Committee medical and welfare program maintained in Israel on behalf of aged, chronically ill and handicapped immigrants.

A cerebral palsy assessment team of physician, therapists and social worker considered whether Avner could be helped. They decided he could. For among the 30 young cerebral palsy victims undergoing assessment at the center, Avner stood out in many respects - in intelligence, will power, an intense desire to study, willingness to undertake painful exercises and ability to
