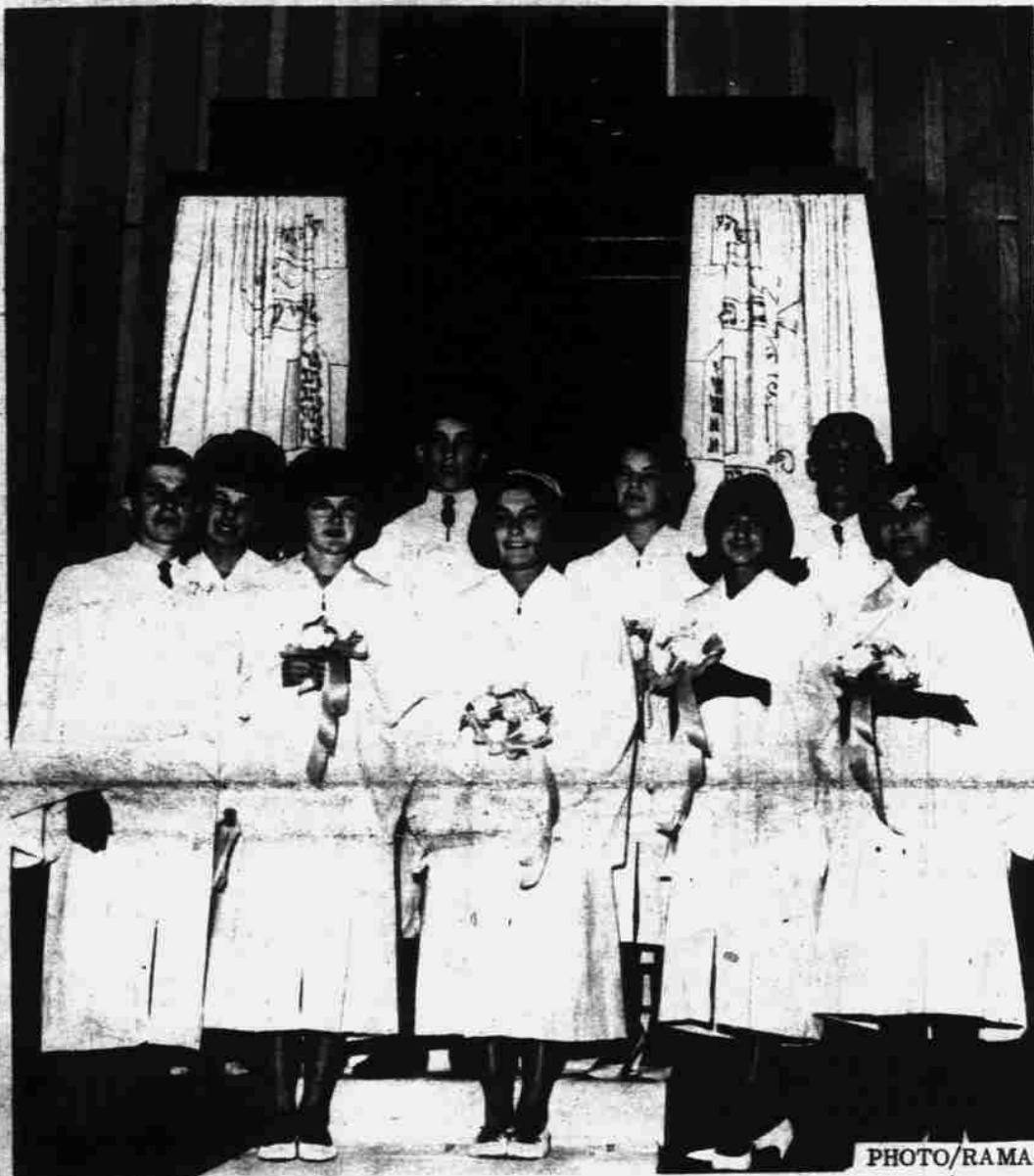

Morris Perlmutter was born in Annapoli, Ukrain, Russia, in 1909. His dad and mother, Max and Miriam Perlmutter brought Morris and his two brothers and two sisters to America in 1913, to settle in Louisville, Kentucky, where they operated a small grocery store through World War I.

mutter's when Max passed away during the 1918 influenza epidemic. The family had moved to Pittsburgh. The only form of recreation were the musical sessions held every Sunday afternoon. It was then that young Morris became fascinated by the violin players in the group.

The youngster told a music teacher, Albert Gordon, his mother was interested in the boy receiving lessons. Mrs. Perlmutter was confused but an uncle who lived with the family was overjoyed and the 50 cents per lesson was paid for in merchandise.
