During her tenure the membership grew and considerable money was raised for the benefit of the Temple. The plaque in the lobby of the synagogue listing the \$100 donors for all to see, is an inspiration for more and bigger and better

During that period, it was Fran who realized the necessity and benefits to be derived from establishing a youth house. Along with Frieda Soskend and Shirley Boyers, no effort or powers of persuasion were spared until the Danny Kolod Youth House became a reality. Expansion of youth activities was the next order of business and it wasn't long before there were tennis courts and other outdoor facilities.

As a member of the Temple board of directors, Fran had her heart set on an enormous play area, modern and complete in every detail. She spent many hours with the Las Vegas recreation director planning a playground, second to none.

About four years ago the president of the Southern Regional office of Hadassah asked Fran to organize a Las Vegas chapter. Fran carefully considered the proposal, weighed all the pros and cons, and then wisely decided the time was not ripe. "Come back in four years," Fran advised.

Three years later, last year to be precise, Fran was again approached. She had taken a 30 month hiatus, be-
