BARNEY BARUCH DEAD AT 94

NEW YORK (WNS) Bernard M. Baruch, American elder statesman who had been advisor to seven Presidents and the confidante of many world leaders, including the late Winston Churchill, died here of a heart attack at the age of ninety-four.

The son of a German Jewish immigrant, Dr. Simon Baruch, who was a surgeon with the Confederate Army and who had witnessed some of the hardest fighting in the Civil War, Bernard Baruch was born in Camden, South Carolina. In 1881 the family moved to New York, where young Baruch attended the College of the City of New York. In later years

Nevada's Rep. Visits Children Patients

Israel-W. Germany Accord

JERUSALEM (WNA) Establishment of full diplomatic ties between Israel and West Germany was disclosed with the simultaneous release in Bonn and here of an exchange of letters on the development between Premier Levi Eshkol of Israel and Chancellor Ludwig Erhard of West Germany.

Declaring that "the attitude of the German Government in the past has proved that we are aware of the special German position toward the Jewish people all over the world, including Israel," the Chancellor noted that he was "greatly satisfied" with the agreement. In obvious reference to the recent cancellation of arms shipments to Israel, the

Chancellor said that "it has been possible to transform by mutual agreement the remaining supplies still outstanding under the previous arrangements with Israel concerning the supply of weapons."

FRANKFURT (WNS) Life sentences for three of the twenty-two Nazis whose 17-month trial on charges of mass murder of Jews in the Auschwitz-Treblinka camp complex just ended, was demanded by the prosecutor in his long summation, in which he detailed the brutalities of each of the defendants, all of whom claimed they were not guilty since they only obeyed orders.

Walter S. Baring, Nevada's Congressman, will receive the "Humanitarian of the Year" award this Sunday, June 27, in the Dunes Hotel at a testimonial dinner benefiting the Children's Asthma Research Institute and Hospital, a non-sectarian institution founded under Jewish auspices.

The hospital, which cares for the most severe cases of intractable asthma, is staffed with the finest medical personnel and the most modern equipment, and is considered among the most noteworthy of its kind in the world. Services to patients from 36 foreign countries and most states, are free, the hospital being supported by voluntary contributions and endowments.

Baring, co-sponsor with

the late John F. Kennedy of the Denny-Baring Bill for the Blind, is being honored for his continual humanitarian support in the battle against children's diseases.

Gov. Grant Sawyer and Sen. Alan Bible are serving as honorary co-chairmen of the event, with Lt. Gov. Paul Laxalt as honorary vice chairman.
