### GOLDBERG HAILED IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM (WNS) The appointment of Supreme Court Justice Arthur J. Goldberg to the post of American Ambassador to the United Nations in succession to the late Adlai Stevenson was hailed by Israeli leaders.

Premier Levi Eshkol declared that "the cause of international justice and world peace will gain" from the move. This comment and the congratulations of President Zalman Shazar and Foreign Minister Golda Meir were cabled to Mr. Goldberg.

Meantime, representa-

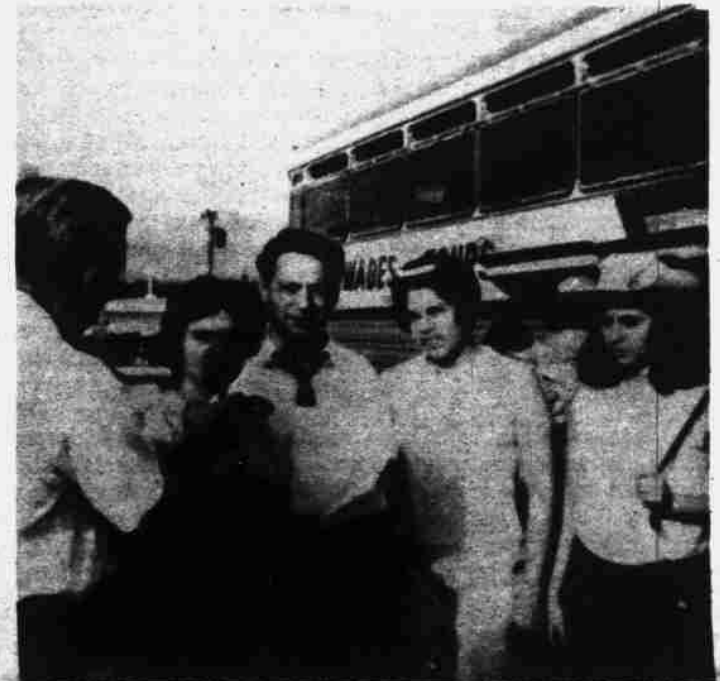
tives of Arab countries at the United Nations, in Washington and Arab statesmen in their own countries maintained an official silence on the appointment. According to a story published in the New York Times, there was a definite feeling among them that the selection of a non-Jew for the post would have been far preferable. But many Arab representatives felt that the fact that the chief United States representative to the U.N. was a Jew would not really matter on the ground that A-

First, the B'nai Brith convention was held at the Dunes Hotel which had some stimulating seminars conducted by some well known people like Dr. Max Vorhspan of the University of Judaism in Los Angeles, Rabbi Joseph Wagner of Temple Beth El in Los Angeles, Dr. Soreff from the Bureau of Jewish Education, the Pres. of Brandise University, and many others. I attended some of these seminars and it was noteworthy that some of the problems faced by the Jewish community of our city in regard to Temple affiliation, dedicated to Judaism and the manner of religious identification among the many other Jewish organizations is a problem in communities much larger than our own. I

On the 21st of July Mr. Abe Schwartz, Principal of our Hebrew School returned with the first contingents of our youngsters from Camp Ramah. Their enthusiasm for the programs at the Camp was astounding. To hear them use Hebrew words mixed in with the English is like music to the ears of those interested in the continuity

### Anti-Semitic Books In Boston

BOSTON (WNS) Distribution and sale of anti-Semitic material at a "God and Country" rally chaired by a leading Birchite was reported by The Jewish Advocate, local English-Jewish weekly.

Among the anti-Semitic display was "The Bigots Behind the Swastika Spree" by Joseph J. Kamp, described by the newspaper as a man with "a record of extreme, right-wing and anti-Semitic

activity going back to the Hitler years." Other anti-Semitic pamphlets were from the hand of Gerald L.K. Smith notorious racist and anti-Semite. Also distributed were publications of the John Birch Society.

The rally was held under the chairmanship of Col. Lawrence Bunker, a member of the executive of the John Birch Society. Bunker told newsmen the anti-Semitic material had been planted.

### German Anti-Semitism Anew

BAMBERG (WNS) The tiny Jewish community of 70 in this city of 70,000 again felt the impact of anti-Semitic vandalism, the seventh incident of its kind in the past three weeks.

In the newest incident, the vandals smeared yellow paint for the third time on a memorial for a synagogue that had been burned by the Nazis. The memorial has been under police surveillance for the past three weeks, when a swastika was found painted on the memorial on the eye of its unveiling. According to police officials, the newest act of desecration occurred when the police guard was in process of being changed.

In addition the anti-Semites sprayed yellow paint on a textile firm owned by Jesse Rosenberg, head of the Jewish community. The vandals also smeared swastikas and nazi symbols on the walls of the U.S. Army munitions depot.
