
Cantorial Notes by Cantor Joseph Kohn

Anti-Semitic Books In Boston

BOSTON (WNS) Distribution and sale of anti-Semitic material at a "God and Country" rally chaired by a leading Birchite was reported by The Jewish Advocate, local English-Jewish weekly.

Among the anti-Semitic display was "The Bigots Behind the Swastika Spree" by Joseph J. Kapmp, described by the newspaper as a man with "a record of extreme, right-wing and anti-Semitic
