### FORTAS HAILED AS TOP LEGAL MIND

WASHINGTON (WNS) President Johnson's naming of Abe Fortas as Associate Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court was hailed by the press throughout the country as a choice that brings to the highest court of the nation one of the best legal minds in the country and a person with a wide grasp of America in change.

In naming Fortas, the President seemingly followed a fifty-year-old tradition of placing at least one Jew on the Supreme Court of the United States. The tradition goes back to 1916, when President Wilson elevated the first Jew to the Supreme Court, Louis D. Brandeis.

Born in Memphis, Tenn., in 1910, Mr. Fortas was given an early Jewish education by his parents. He has not formally been associated

with Jewish institutions and organizations, but he considers himself a Jew religious-wise. He has been a contributor to the United Jewish Appeal in Washington.

Mr. Fortas has long been a personal friend of the President and his frequent advisor on many problems. He first gained national renown when he came to work as an attorney under the New Deal administration of President Roosevelt. He served later as Undersecretary of the Interior under Presidents Roosevelt and Truman. In 1945 he served as advisor to the U.S. delegation to the United Nations. A teacher of law at Yale and other law schools, Mr. Fortas is a member of the Washington law firm of Arnold, Fortas and Porter.

Let us take Katy first, she really cannot remember her birthday, she only knows that she was born in Warsaw, Poland, had four sisters and four brothers, and that she came to London, England, in 1912, where she worked as a dressmaker, on the then high styled fashions. Now let us look at Abe, born in London, March 22, 1891. He by strange coincidence was a tailor. Through mutual friends Abe and Katy were introduced in August, 1914 and married Aug. 1st 1915. Together they estab-

### ISRAEL STATES STERN MEASURES

JERUSALEM (WNS) While officials declined to reveal details of the hour-long conversation between Prime Minister Levi Eshkol and United States Ambassador Walworth Barbour, Mr. Eshkol was believed to have warned Mr. Barbour that Israel would have to take measures to stop the plans of Lebanon and other Arab countries to divert the waters of the Jordan River from which Israel draws water to help irrigate the northern reaches of the Negav desert.

LONDON (WNS) A mass grave, the second to be unearthed within a week and containing the remains of 40 Jews murdered by the Nazis, has been discovered near Loda, Poland. It is reported that police authorities found German rifle shells among the scraps of clothings, shoes and bones in the grave. 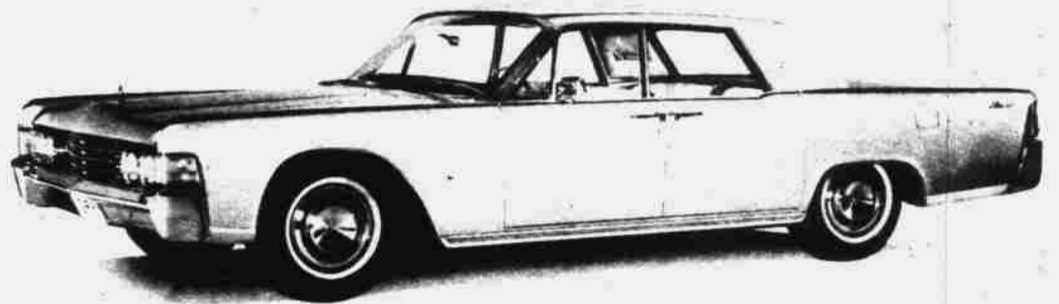
#### Choir Rehearsal Call

### JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) An Arab terrorist who was sentenced to death by an Israeli military court four weeks ago was ordered tried anew by an Israeli appeal court on the ground that he should have been given the opportunity to be defended by a Jordanian lawyer. The defendant, 26-year-old Mahmud Bahr Muhammed Hajazi, made such a request at the trial but it was denied by the military court. He was represented instead by an Israel lawyer appointed by the Tel Aviv Bar Association. Hajazi was captured last January when he and five others sought to blow up a well in a settlement near Jerusalem.

TEL AVIV (WNS) The Eshkol Government in the two years of office has consolidated friendly relations on all fronts of the international arena, Deputy Premier Abba Eban this week declared at a Foreign Press Club luncheon.

ROME (WNS) The World Ort Union, marking its eighty-fifth anniversary in international congress here, was aluded by Zalman Aranne, Israeli Minister of Education, and Rome's Chief Rabbi Elio Toaff, both of whom addressed the opening session. Dr. William Haber of the United States, president of the World Ort Union, presided at the opening session.

TEL AVIV (WNS) Dr. Nahum Goldmann, defending his recent statement with respect to his proposed approach to the Soviet Jewish problem, told newsmen here that he would have preferred that the problem were dealt by Jewish organizations outside of Israel since, he said, "in Russia, they listen more to the voices coming from New York and Chicago."
