School, and finally graduating from Newark College, a branch of Newark University. When he tells of the principal of the high school, who was of German origin, and who's ideals and standards were so high, they must have left a deep indent on all his pupils, one can guess how impressive he must have been. The respect on Danny's face leaves nothing to the imagination. He stayed in college for one year and in October 1941 went into the Army.

When he severed his active duties in 1945, he was 1st. Lieut., Commanding Officer of the Medical Administrator Corp., in Morrison, Louisianna. He may have severed his active duties, but not duty in its entirety, for he remained on the inactive reserves, with commission, for the next two years. Now there were threads to be picked up, and an education to complete, for as a youngster our friend had hoped to be in the optometrist profession, and like many another, due to circumstances he followed the financial road instead and was working towards becoming a C.P.A. Thus, in January, 1946, he went to Rutgers College to earn a Bachelor of Science in accounting, graduating in 1949.

This might sound very routine. Let me assure you that it wasn't, for he worked during the day, and went to school at night. Why? He had a family to raise, and his youngest offspring was already very much in the foreground when he achieved his dream. Strange to relate, it was his mother who saw him get his degree, for his spouse was not only busy with the babies, but felt that as his mother had helped him in prior years, it was the fairest gesture she could proffer.

You may ask at what did he work during the daytime? From 1945-48, he was the office manager in the B and Z Express Co., in West New York. He was offered a position with financial security for life, but his ideals and was in a regular band were not in this direction, every Saturday night, playing
